ALL THE DAYS OF MARCH, Part 7

(A month-long of dealing with public health concerns)

This is the final installment of articles about health concerns in the month of March. The World Health Organization, the United States Center for Disease Control, and other health organizations throughout the world celebrated World Tuberculosis Day (World TB Day) last March 24. This year's observance, like in the past years, aims to raise awareness about the global TB epidemic and to accelerate global efforts for and towards its elimination. World TB Day 2019's theme was "it's Time."

Why do we celebrate World TB Day?

TB still continues to be one of the world's top 10 killer diseases.

When and where was the first World TB Day celebrated?

The World Health Organization and the Royal Netherlands Tuberculosis Foundation at Den Haag, Netherlands, hosted the first "World Tuberculosis Day" in 1995.

The Global Killer

Dr. Robert Koch first discovered tuberculosis in 1882. TB is caused by the bacteria – "Mycobacterium Tuberculosis." The infection generally affects the lungs. In most times, the infection can have no symptoms or the lack of it. This state is known as "Latent tuberculosis." Some people with latent TB infection are more likely to develop TB disease than others. TB disease, if left untreated can spread to other organs. Tuberculosis can also mimic other diseases. In the Philippines, TB is among the top 5 leading causes of morbidity and mortality.

How is it diagnosed?

TB is entertained as a diagnosis if you have chronic cough, fever, night sweats, weight loss, fatigue, difficulty in breathing, or coughing up of blood.

A presumptive diagnosis of TB is established through a positive acid fast bacilli smear in sputum examination. Sputum culture for acid fast bacilli is a more accurate sputum examination for TB.

Chest radiography (x-ray) can reveal infiltrates, nodules, and lesions in the lungs, pointing to TB disease unless proven otherwise.

TB skin test is another way of entertaining the presence of TB bacteria in a person.

Prophylaxis for TB

Chemoprophylaxis for Latent TB should only be given after the presence of TB disease is totally ruled out. INH 300 mg tablet to taken orally on a daily basis for a period of 9 months is given to those with latent TB, regardless of age.

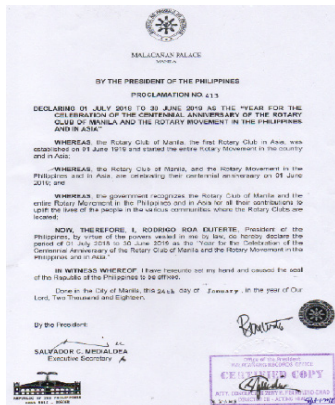


Figure 8 New Manila Doctors Hospital Pasig

His name is also included in the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Register as a duly-registered APEC Architect, one of the first twelve in the country, a testimony owing to his qualifications meeting international acceptance and standards.

In spite of his involvement in various professional, educational, religious and civic activities, Arch. Recto still finds time to read on the latest architectural trends and technological developments, realizing that to a large extent, the success of an architectural practice depends on the quality of design, skill and integrity of its architects, and their unrelenting quest for excellence.

Rtn. Philip is a graduate of the University of the Philippines (UP) where he was a College Scholar and ranked 2nd Place in the graduating class of 1970. Years later, the university would honor him as an outstanding alumnus and institute the Philip H. Recto Design Excellence Awards for best theses at the College of Architecture.

A well-known personage in the construction industry, Recto served as President of the United Architects of the Philippines (UAP) Makati Chapter for 2 terms (1983 & 1984); Chairman of the 11th Architects' National Convention in 1985; and UAP National Vice President in 1987. He was actively involved in the preparation of UAP Document 301- General Conditions (1984 Edition); and UAP Document 700 - Standard Forms for Architectural Practice, both used extensively by practicing architects today. Arch. Recto gained invaluable experience in the design and supervision of modern high-rise office buildings, residential condominiums, schools, churches and industrial buildings during a 5-year stay in Singapore (1971 to 1975). He was the architect-in-charge of the 50-storey International Plaza, the tallest building in Singapore at the time. In 1972, he became an associate member of the Singapore Institute of Architects and in 1984, he was admitted as a member of the ASEAN Association for Planning and Housing.

A well-respected architect, Recto is the recipient of many other prestigious awards, among them are the "Araw ng Maynila" Mayor's Award of Honor for Art and Culture bestowed by Mayor Jose Atienza, Jr. during the 428th founding anniversary of the City of Manila; the "Pinakabantog na Arkitekto sa Taong Sentenaryo" (Most Outstanding Architect of the Centennial Year) Award from the United Architects of the Philippines (UAP) District B-3 and the Outstanding Alumnus in the field of Architecture" Award from his alma mater, the University of the Philippines Alumni Association. He is only the 6th architecture graduate to ever receive such an honor since the establishment of the College of Architecture in 1956. Arch. Recto's outstanding achievement in the field of design was recognized when the rank of Fellow was bestowed upon him by his peers in 1986. This is the highest rank in the professional organization of architects. He also received the "2002 UAP Design Award of Excellence in Architecture" and numerous other awards for his meritorious services to the profession. Dubbed "Designer par excellence" by Construction Magazine (March 1989), his name was acknowledged in VIP's in the Philippine Business (1988), Business & Professionals in the Philippines (1988-1989), ASEAN Who's Who (1991) and Who's Who of the World (1999).

Arch. Recto is generous in sharing his expertise with various government agencies, too. He was sworn in by President Corazon C. Aquino as a Trustee of the Philippine Technological Council in 1987. He sat as a member of the National Building Code Review Committee (Architectural sub-committee) at the Department of Public Works and Highways, and acted as a Consultant of the Construction Industry Authority of the Philippines on the formulation of Uniform General Conditions for Private Construction Contracts. He is a founder and Director of the Society of Philippine Accredited Consultants and served as Chairman of the Architecture



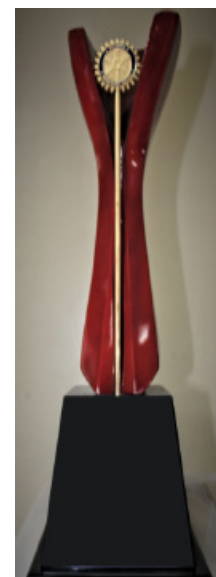
Centennial Hymn is an initiative towards composing a song that will embody the 100 years of the Rotary Club of Manila.

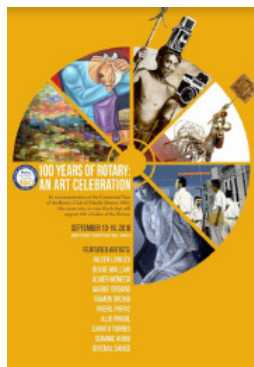

This last April 11th in a lovely special honor dinner during the 45th Annual Convention of the United Architects of the Philippines at the SMX Convention Center, our own distinguished Arch. Philip Recto became only the Fourteenth Recipient of the UAP LIKHA and GOLD MEDAL Awardee.



This award is the highest distinction to be bestowed upon an architect, who already must be a Fellow, who has adhered to the highest standards of professional and ethical conduct, practiced in excellence and prestige in architectural, has rendered significant contribution and service to the UAP, and has performed exceptional achievements and active participation in the concern of the community, government and country.

His firm, PHILIP H. RECTO ARCHITECTS, has over thirty years of experience in the field of architecture and design. Since 1978, in addition to designing some of the tallest buildings in the country, has served commercial, residential, office, institutional, educational, and industrial clients with a wide variety of purposes, as illustrated below. Many outstanding works of the firm have been featured in leading professional journals and newspapers in the Philippines and in Asia. SEEDS OF CHANGE

CORRUPTIONS IN OUR MIDST: Asked by a journalist, Are you honest and incorruptible Sir? A high ranking official in the government answered : I am not corrupt but if someone offers me 100 million dollars for a favor I can dispense within my power, then I will accept it. This reminds me of a story of George Bernard Shaw who at one function met a very attractive lady. After each one downing a glass of wine, their conversation turned very personal and intimate. GBS: If I give you 1 million dollars, will you go to bed with me. The Lady: (hearing a million dollars, smiling) Why not? GBS: How about 100,000 dollars? The Lady hearing a big decline scratched her head and without saying a word just nodded a little. GBS: How about a thousand dollars? Lady (showing anger and exasperations) : What do you think of me, prostitute? GBS: Lady, that had already been established. I am just negotiating for the better price. The two above cases, only show Everyone has a price. And price is subjective, it being a function of one's needs, wants and circumstances. From the very words of Alan Greenspan: "Corruption, embezzlement, fraud, these are all characteristics which exist everywhere. It is regrettably the way Human Nature functions, whether we like it or not. What successful economies do is keep it to a minimum. No one has ever eliminated any part of that stuff". Taken from a micro perspective, say, a case of a policeman earning 700 pesos a day, a 200-300 pesos bribe for a traffic rules infringement is substantial enough to buy his family's needs, more so if he has 2 or 3 families. Or a BIR examiner, a CPA or a Lawyer at that, earning 25,000-50,000 pesos per month. Facing a dilemma whether to accept a share in the tens of millions in savings from a tax assessment compromise, what do you think he will do? (Your guess is as good as mine). In this age of commercialism, "me too", or "why can't I when my Neighbor or Friend does it or has it", aggravates the situation. When my friend bought Hermes bag costing hundreds of thousands pesos or a Lamborghini car in the tens of million pesos, why can't I not have them too when I have the opportunity to make easy money from corruption. Moreso, if the chance of getting caught is small. The situation may not be that serious if these people only do it once in their lives. But most often than not, greed comes into play. They do it every time opportunities come along. Or worse, they create the opportunities by and for themselves. As Socrates once said: "He who is not contented with what he has, would not be contented with what he would like to have". I totally agree with Alan Greenspan. We cannot really eliminate corruptions in any country. All we have to do is minimize it. SELON MOI, values education may help but Technology can probably help more. And close to home, we Rotarians must ask ourselves, which one will make us happy, money or peace of mind?
