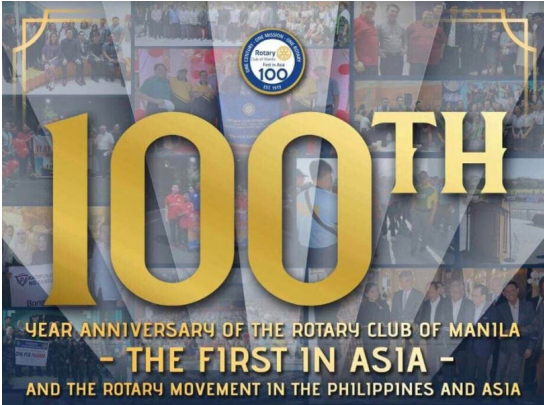

FOODS THAT CAN BOOST AND PRE-SERVE BRAINPOWER

Aside from financial stability in retirement age, maintaining a good brain function by keeping up and preserving recall and protecting brain-based skills, is essential for a full, rewarding, and independent living. Although there is no magic pill to prevent dementia and other age-related decline in brain function and there is no specific food that can ensure a sharp brain as you age, nutritionists came up with a list of certain foods that are linked to preservation and maintenance of brainpower. The healthy dietary pattern includes a lot of fruits, vegetables, legumes, and whole grains. They also promote the use of plant and fish protein and healthy fats, such as olive oil and canola.

These list of foods below are rich in omega-3 fatty acids, B vitamins, and antioxidants. Incorporating these healthy foods in a healthy diet on a regular basis can improve brain health that can transform into a better mental function.

Foods for better brainpower (Harvard Medical School 2019)

1. Green, leafy vegetables. Leafy greens such as spinach and broccoli are rich in brain-healthy nutrients like vitamin K, lutein, folate, and beta carotene. Research suggests these plant-based foods may help slow cognitive decline.
2. Fatty fish. Fatty fish are abundant sources of omega-3 fatty acids, healthy unsaturated fats that have been linked to lower blood levels of beta-amyloid—the protein that forms damaging clumps in the brains of people with Alzheimer's disease. Try to eat fish at least twice a week, but choose varieties that are low in mercury, such as salmon and canned light tuna. If you're not a fan of fish, ask your doctor about taking an omega-3 supplement, or choose terrestrial omega-3 sources such as flaxseeds, avocados, and walnuts.
3. Berries. Flavonoids, the natural plant pigments that give berries their brilliant hues, also help improve memory, research shows. In a 2012 study published in Annals of Neurology, researchers at Harvard's Brigham and Women's Hospital found that women who consumed two or more servings of strawberries and blueberries each week delayed memory decline by up to two-and-a-half years.
4. Tea and coffee. The caffeine in your morning cup of coffee or tea might offer more than just a short-term concentration boost. In a 2014 study published in The Journal of Nutrition, participants with higher caffeine consumption scored better on tests of mental function. Caffeine might also help solidify new memories, according to other research. Investigators at Johns Hopkins University asked participants to study a series of images and then take either a placebo or a 200-milligram caffeine tablet. More members of the caffeine group were able to correctly identify the images on the following day.
5. Walnuts. Nuts are excellent sources of protein and healthy fats, and one type of nut in particular might also improve memory. A 2015 study from UCLA linked higher walnut consumption to improved cognitive test scores. Walnuts also help lower blood pressure. Walnuts are thus good for both the heart and brain.

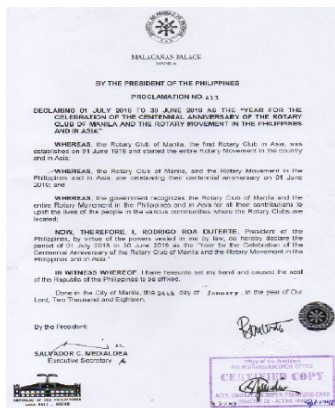
HOSPICIO DE SAN JOSE-NORZAGARAY PROJECT

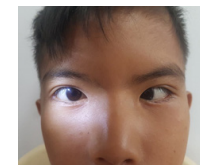

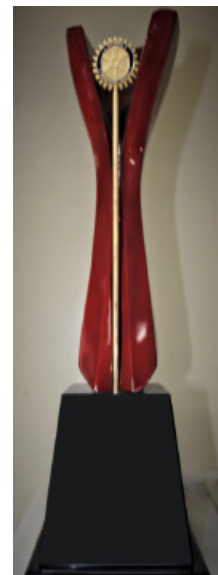
Centennial Hymn is an initiative towards composing a song that will embody the 100 years of the Rotary Club of Manila.

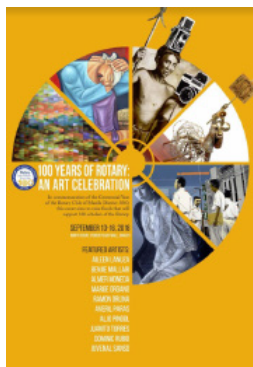


JOURNALISM AWARDS

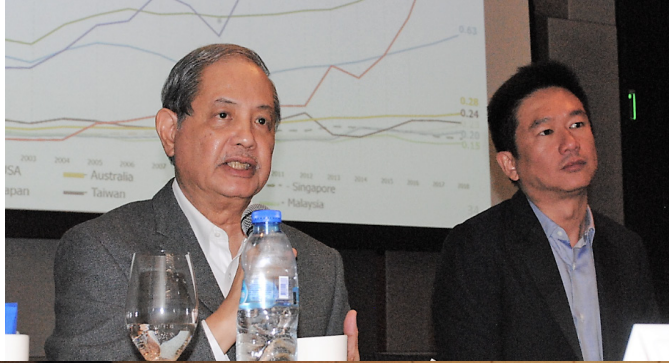

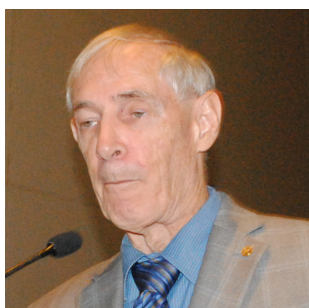

The provisions must be liberal enough to attract foreigners to come in. When Deng Xiao Ping in 1978 opened China to foreign investments, he opened his country to foreign investors without fear, even allowing ownership of properties, but with some limits. He reasoned out that foreigners cannot bring to their countries the properties they own or lease in China. When the term of lease expires the investor will leave behind well developed properties to the advantage of China. Not only the investments created jobs and boosted consumptions, it also created foreign exchange from the products manufactured and exported by these companies where the foreign capital went to. (As of 2018, China's foreign exchange reserve stands at 3 trillion dollars vs US's at about 150 billion dollars, though the former's gold reserve is only 22% of the latter. Both countries have the most number of billionaires, with US's at 705 and China's at 285). In order to attract more foreign investments, the country does not just liberalize property ownership, but it has to create an image that it's a safe and promising investment haven. Stable policies and rules of investments that do not change every time there is change in the political leaderships shall be guaranteed the foreign investors. Dubai, a financial and air traffic hub, is an amazing example. It has no natural fresh water, few oil deposits, arid and hot weather. But its economy is very progressive and dynamic. Though they require foreign investors to partner with locals (that's the rule outside free zones), yet, companies choose to stay and then, thrive there (there are now outlets of Jollibee and Pancake House there). This is because their investments are secured as policies are stable. The Philippines with its human and natural resources offer a lot of economic potentials. If we can only manage effectively China's investments, this will surely start the golden age of the Philippine economy. There's no doubt we, Filipinos can. So why be afraid of China?



SEEDS OF CHANGE

Why Be Afraid of China: Many are scared of the influx to the country of Chinese, their investments and warm bodies. They are afraid that later on we might be strangers in our own country. While this fear could be valid, I think this matter should be addressed and managed properly. There is no denying that the records of China's investments in other countries-Sri Lanka, Maldives and African countries such as Nigeria, Kenya, Angola and Ethiopia, etc. seem not savory. But our country really needs foreign investments which only China can readily provide. The western countries, America included, for many decades have not done enough to provide investments that can provide jobs and prosperity to the Filipino people. I am not a big fan of China, much less a beneficiary of its presence here, but come to think of it, this is a huge opportunity for the country to let go of. It could be boon or bane, but, if managed properly it could be boon. It is a common knowledge that the country offers a lot of opportunities to investors: its big population as consumers and workers, inadequate infrastructures such as roads, bridges, airports, rail ways, housing, etc., which are now the center piece projects of the present administration. It is, indeed, a promising economy. All it needs is an upfront money to pump prime it. Once it's up and running and has attained a critical mass or a level of economic activities enough to create a bandwagon of investors then many other fence sitting countries will follow suit and ride that bandwagon. And of course, we have to create an atmosphere that there's money to be made in the Philippines to attract them. Back to China who can provide the pump prime money. To put this into perspective, you need a good volume of water to start the artesian well to start spewing water. That's how the term pump prime came about. Same with the economy. There is no denying we need the money from China, at this time when other countries are playing safe (sigurista) when it comes to investing in the Philippines. My take is set the rules on investments, amend the provisions in the Constitution on foreign investments.
