**FATHER'S DAY**

(When it's time for dad to face his creator)

"We learned to be so graceful, watching wild horses running. And from those agile angels, we knew the tide was turning. For we watched as on the skyway, the herons circled slowly. While we, mere mortals, watched them fly, our sleepless eyes grew heavy." Bernard John Taupin (1950-), English poet, lyricist, and singer

Dads are mortals (The age of integrity v. despair)

I remember New Year's Eve of 1996 when my dad, who was diagnosed with stomach cancer, told me in Ilocano: "I might not be able to cross the bridge anymore. Take care of your mom." It was the time when I experienced and realized the integrity and dignity of a dying man, frail as he may be, but still in possession of the features of a man I very much admire and love so well, more so, because he was not afraid of death.

According to behaviorist and psychologist Erik Erikson, a person goes through different stages of life. As one passes through them, crises arise in the form of conflicting needs: individual or personal needs v. demands and expectations of society. The successful completion of each stage results in healthy personality and acquisition of basic virtues. The last and final stage, according to Erikson, is the Ego Integrity v. Despair Stage that begins approximately at age 65 and ends in death. To some, this stage can come early. It is in this stage that one has to acquire integrity – "The acceptance of one's one and only cycle that had to be." Success in this stage will lead to the virtue of wisdom. Wisdom enables a person to look back on his life with a sense of closure and completeness, and also the acceptance of death without fear.

When dad needs emotional support (The 7 "E's")

There are times when family members have to face the truth. When dad is about to go away because of some terminal condition, he needs emotional boosting:

1. Educate. Inform him about his condition. Give him chance to talk to other patients who had gone through a similar journey.
2. Enable. Let him move forward and instill confidence in him about the decisions he has to make.
3. Empower. Let him be his own advocate. Encourage him to ask his doctors, friends, and family about his needs and concerns.
4. Empathize. Make him feel that he is not alone.
5. Energize. Let him decide to seek what he feels is the best possible care. Let him ask the right questions, and maybe look for a second or third opinion without being intimidated.
6. Evolve. Let him accept and understand his present situation. In a terminal condition, not all days are bad days, for there are good days as well.
7. Emerge. With the right support, he will emerge in his journey from a cancer patient to a cancer survivor. Who knows? This might lead to a second chance at life.

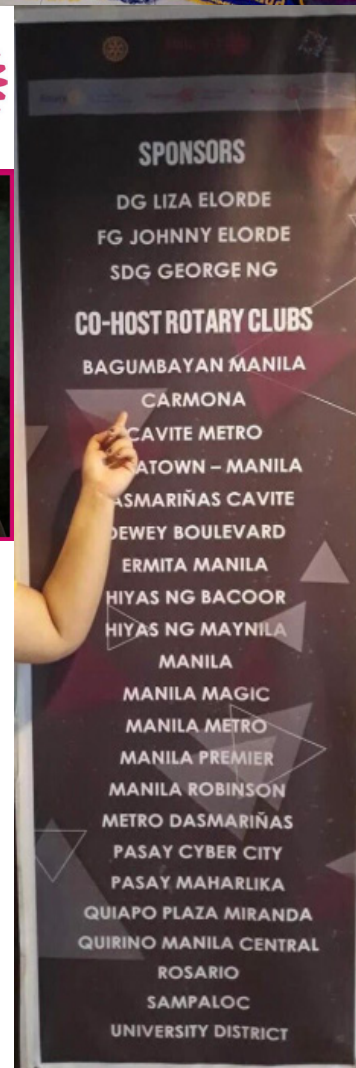

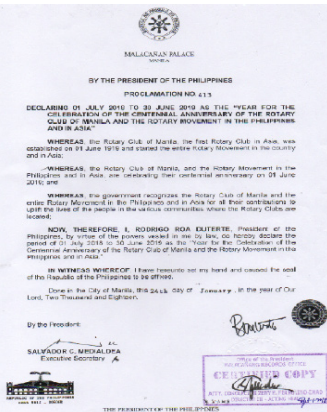


HOSPICIO DE SAN JOSE-NORZAGARAY PROJECT

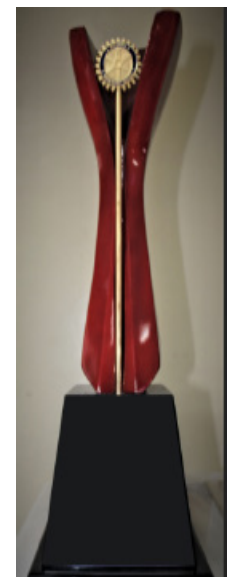

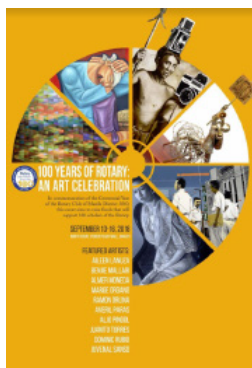


JOURNALISM AWARDS

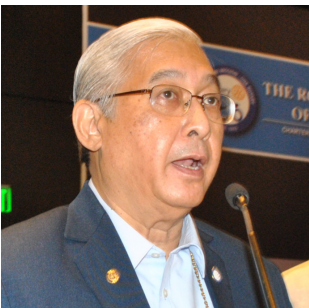

Says Bangko Sentral Governor Benjamin Diokno, himself a Manila Rotarian: "Not many organizations have the distinction of reaching the all-important 'century' milestone. That the RCM have lasted this long is a reflection not only of its long-standing commitment to its ideals and goals, but also of its dynamism, relevance, and influence to the community it serves."

President Rodrigo Roa Duterte signed Presidential Proclamation No. 413 declaring July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 as the Year for the Celebration of the Centennial Anniversary of the Rotary Club of Manila and the Rotary Movement in the Philippines and Asia.

"This proclamation will open new doors for Rotary Club of Manila. I look forward to the many new opportunities this will bring to our Club and the many Rotary Clubs in the Philippines—for support, partnerships and cooperative endeavors with government Institutions and local government units, and the ability to help as long as they are aligned with Rotary's different noble advocacies for service to the Filipino people," says Pineda.

Rotary's motto, "Service Above Self—has endured for a reason—there will always be people who have less in life. The values that Rotarians have exemplified as members in fellowship, global understanding, ethics, integrity, diversity, leadership, and service—will be essential to paving the way forward to the next century," he says.

The Rotary Club of Manila was officially chartered on June 1, 1919. The first officers were: Leon J. Lambert, president, Alfonso SyCip, as vice president; E. E. Elser, secretary, Walter A. Beam, treasurer. The 38 charter members included three Filipinos—Alfonso SyCip, a rice importer; Gabriel Lao, a lawyer; and G. Nieva who was in warehousing. The alien members were mostly business leaders of the largest corporations of the day.

Relates Rafael "Raffy" Garcia III, Rotary International director, 2018-2020: "The Rotary Club of Manila has always held the reputation of being not only the first and the largest Rotary Club in the Philippines, but also the Club with the most distinguished Rotarians. Its membership has always been the crème de la crème of Philippine society and industry, including many of the government officials who have crafted the direction of our democracy.

RCM was home to MAT Caparas when he was elected as the first and only Filipino to become president of Rotary International in 1986-1987. "It is awe-inspiring to look back that many great leaders of the club have contributed immensely to our communities," gapes Rudy B. Bediones, district governor Rotary International District 3810, 2018-2019 and RCM president in 2013-2014.

Bediones says RCM put up the Boy Scout movement, Community Chest Foundation, Philippine Band of Mercy, the Safety Organization of the Philippines, Philippine Cancer Society, Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, Philippine Tourism Association, Welfareville, TOWER (The Outstanding Workers of the Republic) Awards Foundation, RC Manila Foundation, RCM Medico-Surgical Missions Foundation, Philippine Rotary Pacemaker Bank Foundation, Sagip-Kabataan (Save the Children) Foundation, RCM Eyebank Foundation.

RCM regularly sends medical and surgical missions to depressed areas, and sponsors programs in sight and hearing conservation, drug abuse prevention, health and hygiene education, nutrition, energy conservation, social justice, teacher development, public order and safety, peace and conflict resolution, and through the "Sagip-Kabataan Project," the rehabilitation of children at risk (street children) and juvenile offenders.

RCM provides financial assistance to indigent families who have children with life-threatening congenital heart disease (Rotary's Heart for Little Angels). The Club hopes to plant 100 million trees in the future.

Pineda says: "We have started our legacy projects with our Rotary Club of Manila Educational Assistance Program. The Adopt a Student Project with our academic partners, Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Maynila and the Polytechnic University of the Philippines, has been launched last May 3, 2018."

RCM wants to fund with P2,000 monthly stipend up 100 poor and marginalized students. Members provide the money.

RCM has Sari-Saring Aralan, an out-of-school-youth education project with partners, the Ayala Foundation, Grameen Australia Philippines, Rotaract, and the City of Manila.

"Education is the future of any generation, hence, the need to prepare our youth for tomorrow," explains Pineda.

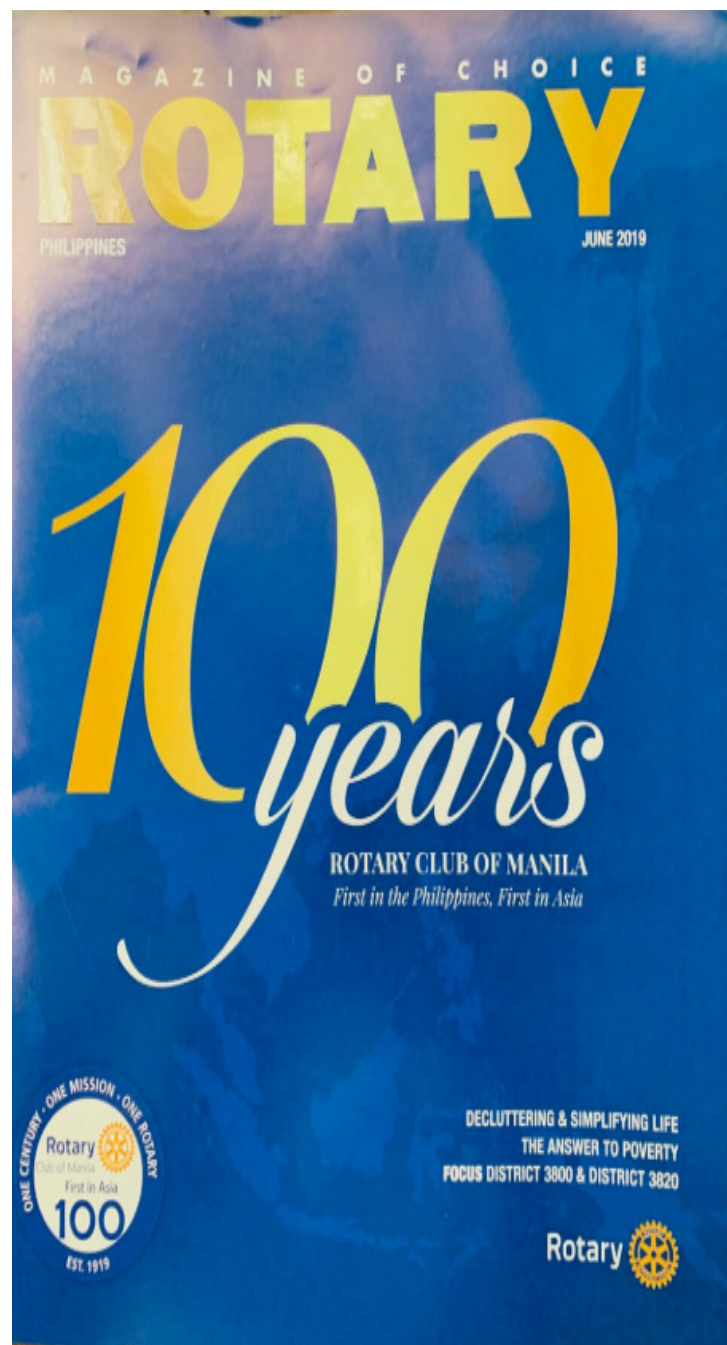

Rotarian zeitgeist - raison d'être for centennial fete

We like to imagine that in a luncheon at the house of Leon J. Lambert, Rotary's first president in the Philippines on Jan. 12, 1919, the confreres' plan was just to form a social group to unwind, banter on mundane matters, and when a hint of something worthwhile for business or professional opportunity fills the air, the talks would drift to forming alliances, partnerships or mutual and beneficial exchanges.

Unfortunately, this was also a time when European powers were in mortal and senseless combat, the violent winds of World War I affecting a place as remote then as the Philippine archipelago. It was also two decades earlier when the Filipinos were deprived of their independence by the Americans through a bloody one-sided war, yet bewitched the Filipinos in so short a time with their alleged burden to teach us the art of democracy and self-governance under the mantra of Manifest Destiny.

The Rotary movement in the Philippines was born against a backdrop of social Darwinism as the prevailing thought in American life at the start of the American occupation in the Philippines. In the World's Fair in 1903 in Saint Louis, Missouri, the idea of white superiority flourished in the exhibition of the "development of man", the Philippine Negrito was described as the missing link among the non-western people assembled there which included the Zulus from South Africa and the American Indians. The 1904 Olympics in the same city also featured an alternative Games called 'Anthropology Days', organized by whites, to show the differing times of the races of mankind. A Moro from the Philippines won the javelin. This was a kind of *schadenfreude* as pleasure was in display at the misfortune of others.

There was no doubt that the first civilian Governor General of the Philippines, William Howard Taft, was a social Darwinist. When he became the US President in 1909 he refused to follow the example of his predecessor, Theodore Roosevelt, of appointing blacks to federal positions. Eugenics was a strong movement in the US in 1920 and at that time Leonard Darwin, the son of Charles Darwin had encouraged the policy that superior people breed more than the inferior people. During the early years of the Americans in the Philippines, the people of the mountain province were declared unfit to drink alcohol,

no matter that they need a heat in the cool mountain climate. The Darwinian thought among a sector of the Americans provoked undercurrents of Filipino suspicion and resentment towards the whites.

With the kindling of the Rotarian spirit in the country in 1919, the icy relation with the Americans in the countryside started to thaw and it was not long before the relationship became warm and special. It is no coincidence that the social engagements of the early Rotarians composed of Americans and Filipinos had replaced the Darwinian thought of white supremacy to one of equality based on shared human values of charity and sharing. Thus, with one fell swoop, American face became kinder and its kinship with the Filipinos became friendlier and reliable. It was not long before a movement of service became a spectacle, a positive force was mobilized by the Rotarians to help victims of calamities, protect the health of the young with its antipolio vaccines, fed the hungry, helped the disabled and the disadvantaged, the impetus for such causes like the Boy Scout movement and recently environmental protection.

We are therefore celebrating less because the Rotary Club of Manila, the first in Asia, was born, but more because a rotary movement like the gathering of clouds had established a climate of self-less service in this part of the world. The Rotarian zeitgeist is the *raison d'être* for the centennial fete.

We, the members of the steering committee led by Centennial President Susing Pineda, invite all Rotarians to partake of our humble offer - the Centennial Day experience on June 21, 2019, a capsule of that glorious 100 years, to reflect Rotary's *shadow of the past, reality of the present, and its vision of the future*. Guests will be invited to a formal gala night chaired by businessman Hermie Esguerra on June 22 and an early evening Salubong Party on June 20 chaired by businessman Phillip Ong on different venues.

The Filipino Rotarians are fortunate to participate in this grand human saga commenced a century past. It was an exciting journey, this Rotary life, because it was never short of the Shakespearean weaknesses and challenges yet the results are no less noble and meaningful to our lives.

LAMBERT FELLOWS

A Lambert Fellow is a person whose happiness grows from the soil of goodness, service, charity and generosity. To him one is happiest when he serves best.

This is an award given on the occasion of the Centennial celebration of the Rotary Club of Manila on June 21, 2019, a singular club whose examples of good deeds were rooted

in the noblest of human nature. It is the logic of nature that good seeds grow on fertile soil, that when they put out shoots with the blessings of sunshine, they could become the trees that give comfort with their shades, or fruit that sustains, or flowers that give scent or beauty to the senses. Such was the natural evolution of the Rotary Club of Manila, and in time, it became a nationwide and undisputed primary movement of service in the Philippines and in Asia.

All that metaphor said above, we owe it to Leon J. Lambert, the first and Charter President of the Rotary Club of Manila, who hosted the first Rotary luncheon in his Pasay City home on January 12, 1919 with Roger D. Pinneo as his guest. The latter had been commissioned by the Rotary Club of Seattle to assist in the organization of the first Rotary Club in the Far East. Among those in attendance were Messrs. E. E. Elser, James Geary, A.W. Beam.

We wish to continue this metaphor through the living reality practiced by these chosen Lambert Fellows on the occasion of the 100 years of the founding of the Rotary Club of Manila and the Rotary movement of the Philippines and Asia.
