NON-VIOLENCE

(A proven method to social change)

The worldwide use of social media, globalization, fluctuation in the market and economy, unemployment, migration, global warming, and political unrest are just some factors that lead to global issues that need solutions. Problem solving that can come from different sectors of society and political colors can lead to different ideas, including escalation of violence (example, Hong Kong).

Non-violence was successfully employed during the "flower power generation" of the 1960s that had brought about social changes in society. Non-violent marches, vigils and protests during the era had led to spread of peaceful ideas.

We cannot help but read through the mind of Gandhi who once said: "Non-violence is the greatest force at the disposal of mankind. It is mightier than the mightiest weapon of destruction devised by the ingenuity of man."

Go for RAKS

RAKs refers to RANDOM ACTS OF KINDNESS. The concept of Random Acts of Kindness has taken off with the rise of social media, as the beneficiaries of RAKs often post their gratitude for the stranger online. Today, go out of your way for a stranger, simply to brighten his day. Remember a brother, a friend, or a loved one. Give them a call and perhaps, just tell them, "I miss you." Leave a positive note with a friend. The possibilities are endless.

Modeling theory

Teachers, together with parents and skilled persons in the family, have the responsibility of molding a young person's personality towards non-violence. Psychologist Albert Bandura in 1965 claimed that the personal development of a child depends on social learning. They learn by imitating others rather than through their own self-experience. Non-violence instilled to a child in school, by teachers and skilled persons in the family, is a value that a child will carry on throughout his life.

"KUMILOS KAIBIGAN": THE SPIRIT OF THE MADELINE DELP ADVOCACY

"Kumilos Kaibigan" is the spirit behind Wheelchair Foundation Grant 2019 to Rotary International District 7670 USA – District 3810 Philippines with the support of Live Boundless Foundation

PDG William "Bill" Biddle is the GSE Team Leader 2009-10 from RID 7670 who developed a 10-year long friendship with his counterpart PP Raymond Ciriaco the GSE Team Leader from RID 3810 that led to his "I shall return to the Philippines" promise which he fulfilled 9 times. The year that he was District Governor, RY 2017-2018, he was unable to visit so he invited PP Raymond Ciriaco to be a speaker in his District Conference 2018. In this conference, he also invited as keynote speaker. Ms. Wheelchair USA 2017 Madeline Delp who is also from Asheville, North Carolina. In that conference, after her inspiring message Ms. Madeline Delp sat next to PP Raymond Ciriaco who asked her, "Have you been to the Philippines?" and her reply to him was, "No, but I would love to!" and this led Bill Biddle and Madeline through her own foundation, "Live Boundless".

Since the Group Study Exchange of RY 2009-2010, Bill Biddle found every reason for his return:

- Became Honorary Member of RC Pasay Cyber City, District 3810, Metro Manila in June 2010.
- Returned to District 3810 in March 2011. Participated in Feeding Project in Manila and a Feeding Project at Akap Bata in Pasay City, Metro Manila.
- Wheelchair Distribution Team Member to District 3820 in Laguna Province, District 3800 in San Juan West, and District 3790 in Angeles City, Pampanga, Philippines, May 2012. During this distribution, our team delivered wheelchairs to residents of Smokey Mountain which is the large city dump in Manila.
- Team Leader, Wheelchair Distribution, District 3780, RC Cubao West and District 3820, RC Lucena South, August and September 2013. Following wheelchair distribution, interfaced with RC Manila South and participated in Feeding Projects and Dental Education Clinics to children of indigent communities in Metro Manila.
- Team Leader, Rotary Friendship Exchange to District 3810, Metro Manila, Philippines, March, 2014. Following the Friendship Exchange, traveled to Tacloban, Leyte and Cebu to assess need for wheelchairs. Visited

a total of five municipalities and Tacloban in Leyte. In Cebu, met with DG Ed Chongbion, District 3860, and President Tess Beltran Chan, Cebu Chamber of Commerce to assess wheelchair need for Bantayan Island.

- Partnered with RC Cabuyao Circle, District 3820 to supply new shoes for elementary school students in Sta. Rosa, Laguna Province, Philippines.
- Provided annual financial support to 5 children in Antimonan, Quezon

Province, Philippines who lost their father many years ago. Contributed funds necessary for the children to receive their education.

- Funded a Literacy Project to an elementary school in Iligan Bay. Purchased text books for Academic Year 2013 for students in the 8th grade. Total of 53 books purchased. Worked with Rtn Mercy S Gomez, Teacher and member of RC Iligan Bay, District 3870.
- Contribute annually to LYN Charities, Manila. This program provides food to street children in Metro Manila, Philippines. Non-Rotary Project.
- Team Leader, Wheelchair Distribution to District 3820, February 2016, in Santa Rosa, Cabuyao, Lipa, LucenaCity, Sariaya, Tayabas, Atimonan, Naga and Daet.

- Joint Service Project with Rotary Club of Pasay Cyber City, District 3810, Philippines to benefit indigent children. Books and Literacy.

After his term as District Governor, PDG Bill Biddle with Lady Joanne Biddle returned last year 2018 to stand as principal sponsor to the wedding of GSE 2010 team member Rtn. Jacqueline Corpuz-Cloma which makes him "Kapuso, Kapatid, Kapamilya at Kumpare" to PP Raymond Ciriaco. Upon consulting with all his local counterparts from other districts who received wheelchairs from PDG Bill Biddle's efforts, PP Rayms determined that the cost of just bringing in a 40-foot high cube container of about 300 wheelchairs after duties and taxes even after it's been paid for is a whopping P450,000. Discouraged, he had to tell PDG Bill that "it's too much" for which he replied, "I've given to 8 out of the 10 districts in the Philippines and I will make this happen for 3810".

PDG Bill Biddle and District 7670 raised \$16,750 from among its generous rotarians and Live Boundless Foundation fundraiser raised the other \$16,500 which was matched by The Wheelchair Foundation grant who gave \$21,000 for a total of \$54,250. The Wheelchair Grant team 2019 led by PDG Bill Biddle included DGE G. Davit Waechter also from District 7670, Live Boundless Foundation COO Ms Madeline Delp together with Drew Lace and Matt Reese.

The Wheelchair Grant 2019 team arrived October 5 and will leave on October 19 after their distribution missions in Manila, Pasay, Cavite and Occidental Mindoro. The 100-year old Rotary Club of Manila, the first and biggest in Asia, invited Ms. Madeline Delp to be their speaker on October 10, 2019 through the efforts of PP Alvin Lacambacal and PP Romy Nones.

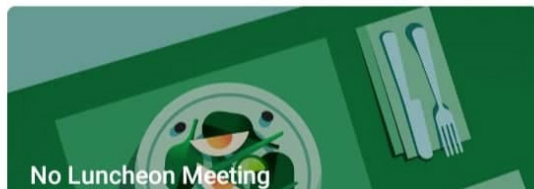

"genuine love" between family members ruined by mere monetary considerations?

I have been told that the original spirit of Rotary, if ever it existed, is dead. That is why even if we pledge to uphold the truth every week, it is only as good as an empty promise. The "Four Way Test" serves only as a nice slogan and a superfluous street advertisement for the club. Another Rotarian contends that since Rotary is not central to his life, he does not take it seriously, and therefore, he does not feel compelled to be truthful.

It is not my intention here to judge other people, nor to assess another Rotarian's doings in Rotary. But equating seriousness with being truthful and humanitarian is beyond my comprehension. This again exemplifies how society today values truth as something that is burdensome and even impractical.

It is also not my intention here to preach. I just want to pose some questions to Rotarians and maybe trigger some thought processes in him or her on the ideals of Rotary. It is up to the individual Rotarian whether he or she would endeavor to live the Rotary values.

We cannot point to other Rotarians, or even to other people, as excuses for our actions in Rotary and in our personal lives. Rotary, as life, is what we make it to be. But this does not diminish my personal belief that there are absolute moral values that should be lived by men, as human beings created by God. For what it's worth, I hope that at the very least this message would contribute to increase the sense of respect for each other and to discourage any defamation, if there are, in our club.

to the editor so that we can apply what we have studied to current events in the Philippine society. I chose the responsibility of media as my topic, placing it in context of the coups happening in the country at the time. I did not hesitate to quote John Paul II in my composition, citing his exhortation to the media to recognize their responsibility to transmit the truth to the masses. My teacher found my letter well crafted enough to send it to a national business newspaper, where it appeared a few days after.

The late pope was a staunch defender of the truth, emphasized by his encyclical "Veritatis Splendor" (the splendor of truth). The new pope is not different. Acclaimed as a theological titan of our times, Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger produced an astounding amount of books, articles and interviews. I have deeply admired his wisdom and clarity of mind even before he was elected pontiff. So I was profoundly moved and joyful when he became the 265th pope.

I have written in a previous issue that I unashamedly admit that my personal rationale for doing Rotary work has always been grounded on my religion and my moral convictions. Idealistic as it may seem, I can find no other motivation for being a Rotarian. I know that this appears out of place. At the beginning of this column I quoted Cardinal Ratzinger. Why? I have personally experienced being laughed at and ridiculed, no less by fellow Rotarians, for trying to be truthful. Oh yes, I can identify very much with that passage.

Struggling to live a truthful life can indeed be very lonesome. "Honesty is such a lonely word", Billy Joel sings. How many souls have been driven to despair and depression, ostracized by everyone around, as a consequence of trying to hold on to what is right?

Deceit and hypocrisy appears to be the prevalently accepted values in present-day society. Sincere concern for persons in our lives takes a back seat for personal gain and gratification. We constantly bend or modify the truth not only in our business transactions but also in our dealings with others. We use lies to destroy the good name of another or to transform his life to our own tastes and liking. How many "friendships" have we seen built on convenience and self-need, and not on charity? True friends respect you for who you really are, not for who they want you to be. And how often have we seen

I didn't know that Rotary had any dealings with the late Pope John Paul II. In my almost three years as a Rotarian, I had the impression that it was taboo to relate Rotary with anything of a particular religion. I even occasionally edit the invocations in this bulletin, thinking that non-Catholics might be offended by any reference to God as "Our Father", in spite of the fact that these prayers were already being used by Rotary Clubs in the US and transmitted to our club by our own district.

So it was a surprise when I received an email from SDG Rey Garcia, revealing that in many occasions RI Presidents and leaders had visited the Vatican. John Paul II was even a recipient of the Rotary Award for World Peace and Understanding back in 1982. And in the year 2000, he spoke before 18,000 Rotarians. In a letter to Vatican Secretary of State Cardinal Sodano last April 5, RI President Glenn Estess described John Paul II as a "friend of Rotary" who "shared many of the ideals of human brotherhood and sisterhood and selfless service that inspired the original founders of Rotary."

By this time it is already a cliché, but I would say that the events of the past few weeks in Rome, though watched by the whole world on television, have affected me in a personal way. You see, it has always been a standard response for me to include Pope John Paul II, when asked in high school essays or job applications, as one of the three people I admire most. But as I grew older and eventually when the Pope passed away, I realized that I meant it more than just an answer to impress and to feign wisdom. Several years ago, I wrote an emotional letter to a friend. In one portion I said that the reason why young people felt very close with John Paul II was that he provided a role model in an age sorely lacking in personalities who would inspire the youth to be good and to do good in a violent and materialistic world. "Be not afraid!" resounded in the hearts and minds of young people in different parts of the globe.

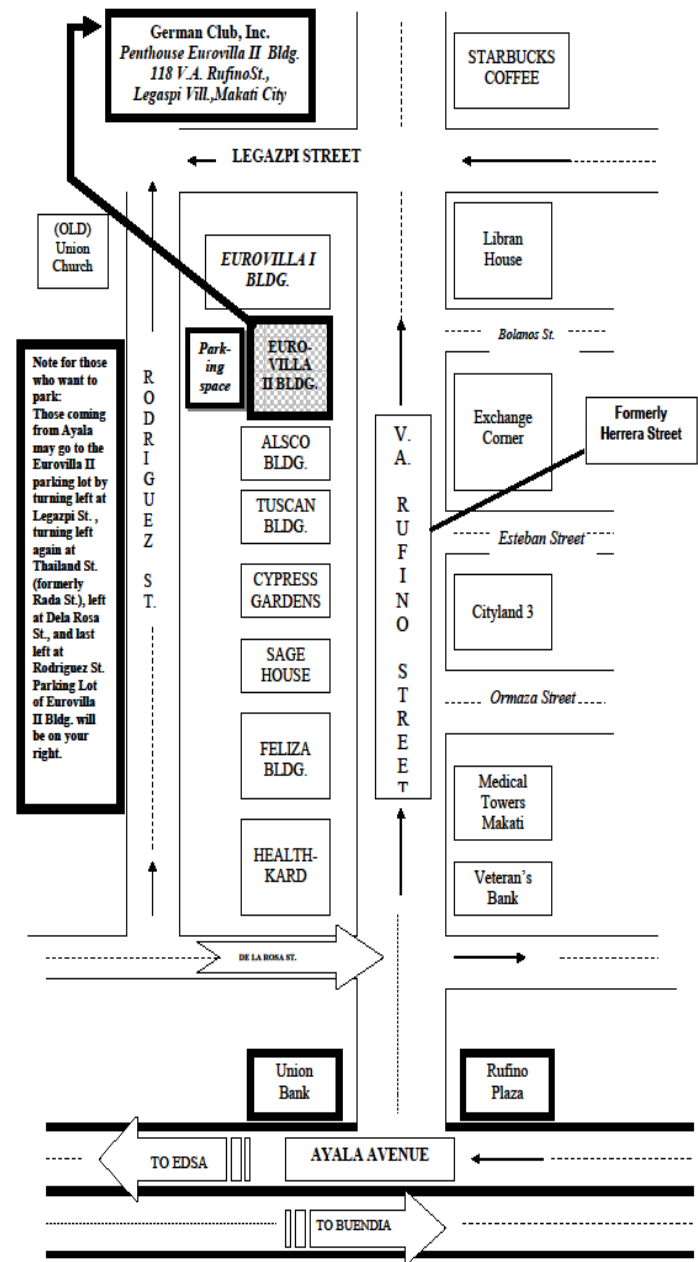
