He was a Senior Fellow of the Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, University of Colombo, Sri Lanka and Advisory Board Chair of the Asia Pacific Malaria Elimination Network.

MAJORITY FLOOR LEADER REP. FERDINAND MARTIN ROMUALDEZ BARES ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF 18th CONGRESS

House Majority Floor Leader Rep. Ferdinand Martin Romualdez bared the accomplishments of the 18th Congress. He began by establishing the direction of having a favorable investment climate, making the country a much sought after investment destination. He likewise emphasized on the bills creating the three departments, namely, the Department of Filipinos Overseas, the Department of Disaster Resiliency and the Department of Water Resources. The regular session held at the Batangas City Convention Center after the Taal Volcano eruption was meant to ensure that the House of Representatives was more cognizant of the needs of the people in order to draw up measures aimed at the immediate aid of the evacuees. He likewise spoke of a bill giving power to the Department of Health (DOH) to approve the service capabilities of the hospitals under its jurisdiction. He even gave number of legislative measures approved. The postponement of the Sangguniang Kabataan and Barangay Polls were likewise mentioned as well as the fifth edition of the Salary Standardization Law and the Sin Tax Law. Other measures mentioned were the Rice Subsidy for Purchase of Palay as well as the Amended Foreign Investments Act of 1991. However, the most applauded measure was the ecological measure supporting T.R.E.E.S. of the Rotary Club of Manila. Indeed, the 80% trust rating of the House Speaker and a +49 in the SWS Survey are clear indications of a great leadership in the legislature.

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Pakistan's popular former president sentenced, seeking vindication; Romualdez in Rotary and need for Permanent Disaster Fund

We were disturbed by press dispatches from Islamabad that our friend, the exiled former Pakistan President and military leader Pervez Musharraf had been convicted and handed the death sentence towards the end of last year for treason.

In poor health and in his hospital bed in Dubai, in the United Arab Emirates, he was straining to speak and defended his decision to suspend the Constitution and impose emergency rule in 2007.

When we were speaker of the House and chairman of the International Conference of Asian Political Parties (ICAPP), we invited Musharraf in 2005 to address a joint Senate-House session of Congress, following our earlier invitations to the presidents of the US, China, and India, and he was very impressive with his eloquent English on the need for Asia-wide reforms and responsive and dynamic government.

In his speech before the joint session, Musharraf cited his doctrine of "Enlightened Moderation" where he called on Islamic nations to reject terrorism and extremism and instead promote popular socio-economic development. He also called on the Western nations to help resolve the long-standing political disputes that have caused suffering in the Islamic world.

And he had good meetings with President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo and another military hero, former President Fidel V. Ramos.

We are almost certain that Musharraf will appeal his conviction which, according to press reports, has infuriated Pakistan's security establishment, and the military spokesman said the Armed Forces were in "pain and anguish" over the decision.

From Dubai, the former president slammed the decision as the product of a long-nurtured "personal vendetta" and was reported to be planning to appeal the conviction.

Our friend, House Majority Leader Ferdinand Martin Romualdez addressed the regular meeting of our Rotary Club of Manila (RCM) held at the Manila Polo Club last Thursday.

He discussed the legislative agenda of the House of Representatives, the priority bills, as well as the bills passed and enacted into law. Martin answered the Rotarians' questions during the forum which followed his speech.

Congressman Romualdez, who represents Leyte's First District, is also the president of Lakas-CMD (Christian Muslim Democrats) political party, where we previously served in various capacities - as secretary general, president, and then as chairman - and which was the country's largest and ruling party for some 15 years.

We are also delighted to point out that we co-founded, with former President Fidel V. Ramos and the late Senator and Foreign Affairs Secretary Raul Manglapus the Lakas-NUCD-UMDP (National Union of Christian Democrats-United Muslim Democrats of the Philippines), a rather long name to reflect the unique coalition of Christians and Muslims, which we later shortened to Lakas-CMD.

The Lakas-CMD-UMDP was then Defense Secretary Ramos' political vehicle when he ran and won the presidency in 1992.

Going back to the Rotary meeting, we in the 101-year-old Rotary Club of Manila (RCM), the oldest Rotary organization in Asia, led by President Jackie Rodriguez, support the creation of the Department of Disaster Resilience (DDR), principally authored by Speaker Alan Peter Cayetano, Leyte Rep. Lucy Torres Gomez, and Albay Rep. Joey Salceda, among others, an initiative which perhaps is long-delayed but for which we commend the House of Representatives, Senate, and the Duterte administration for fast-tracking its enactment.

The proposed department would

oversee and coordinate the preparation, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of disaster and climate change resilience plans and programs." It would also "set standards for the construction of evacuation centers and work with local government units in the maintenance of these centers."

During the public forum, following the speech of Rep. Romualdez, we stressed to him and to our fellow Rotarians the importance of allocating in the national budget a permanent fund to be used exclusively for the rescue, relief, and rehabilitation of individuals, families, and communities devastated by natural disasters.

The fund help address the people's most urgent needs following typhoons, floods, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, etc., is an urgent necessity in our country. For natural calamities are continuous threats to our people, communities, infrastructure, agriculture, and economic gains.

With this fund, which can be increased every budget year, the evacuation, delivery of needs and services, and the rehabilitation of victims and communities ravaged by natural calamities will be immediately addressed.

The national government and the local government units would not be scrounging for funds whenever natural disasters which are quite frequent and will thus not be begging for donations or charity.

Of course, donations from private individuals, companies, and foundations as well as foreign governments are welcome and much appreciated but having a permanent fund for calamities will make the evacuation delivery of services, and rehabilitation of victims more expeditious and efficient.

The permanent fund for natural disasters will augment the calamity fund allotted to the municipalities and provinces, which, at the time, is not sufficient to cover the urgent expenses following natural disasters.

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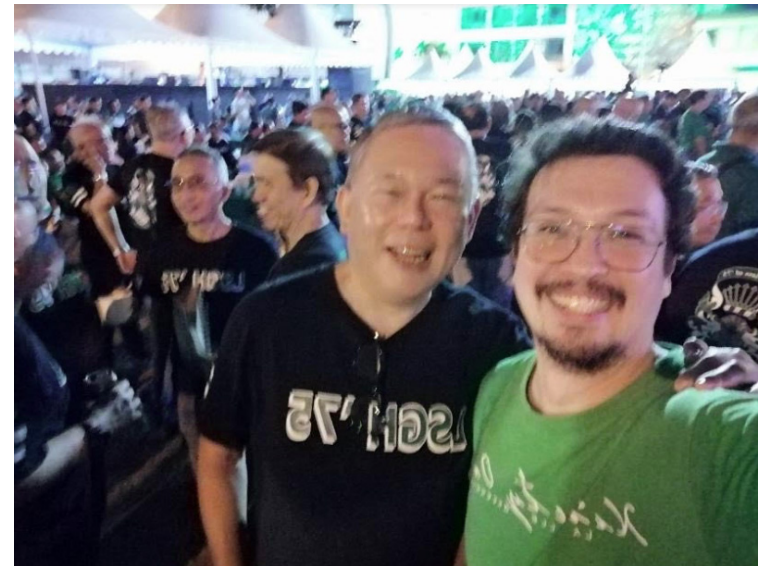
