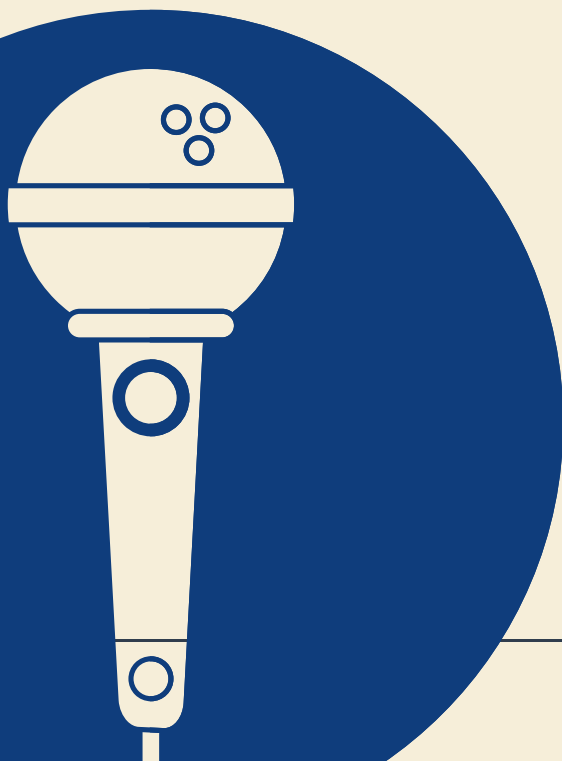

More are in the pipeline and we are sure we can achieve them all by the end of our term. The projects we are undertaking have to roll over with the change of leadership to make it sustainable.

We are blessed that the President of the Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PCCI) is none other than our fellow Manila Rtn. Benedicto "Dicky" V. Yujuico. Through DE/Dir. Johnny Chotrani, a formal meeting will be hosted for thirty (30) Rotarians on the prospects and challenges the country will have to embrace to remain competitive for the near future. We shall also support the leadership coaching/mentoring programs of PCCI and also invite their members to join RCM.

Our membership is growing. We thank members who have invited talented and successful leaders to join RCM. We would like to ask you to invite one (1) member to RCM. Based on record, many have not invited at least one member to join our club. Imagine if they did!!!!

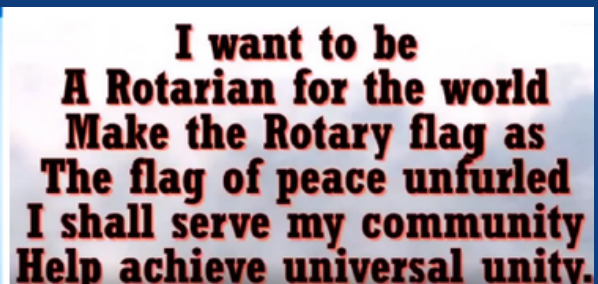

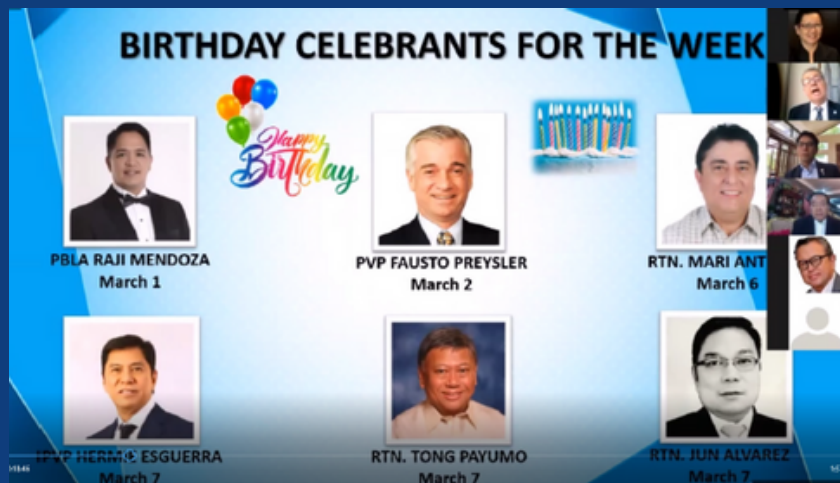

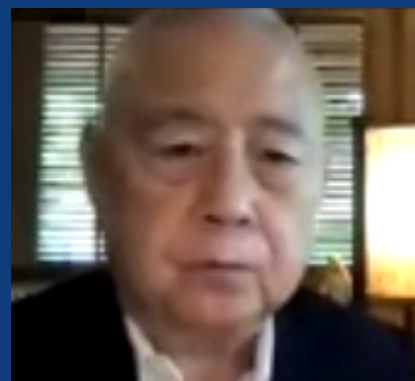

PCCI Urges LGUs to do More to Revive Domestic Tourism

PCCI urges LGUs to do more to revive domestic tourism

The Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PCCI), the largest business organization in the country, has urged local government units to go beyond and above the streamlined travel restrictions of the national government to accelerate the recovery of domestic tourism.

PCCI President Amb. Benedicto Yujuico said this as he expressed full support to the move by the government to streamline travel rules and regulations in tourist destinations.

The Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) recently approved the uniform travel protocols for local government units where travelers are no longer required to present an RT-PCR test unless specified by the LGU prior to travel.

Yujuico underscored the need for LGUs to go over and beyond what is being required by the guidelines of the national government agencies.

"Investing in healthcare systems in the country's tourist spots must be central to tourism planning now that COVID-19 is driving tourists to think about their health and safety first," said Yujuico.

"Investing in infection control facilities such as widespread availability of disinfectants, improvement of ventilation, and re-designing of spaces to allow greater social distancing are significant to reinvigorate the industry and it will benefit the constituents as well."

PCCI believes that domestic tourism could serve as catalyst for restarting not only Philippine tourism, but also the economy as a whole. Data from the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) shows that from 2000 to 2018, tourism's contribution to the country's GDP averaged at 7.4%. In 2018 and 2019, the sector's contribution grew to 12.7%,

The harmonization of travel protocols under the IATF-EID Resolution 101 will further facilitate travel movement, flow of goods and services, and boost local tourism.

To help in the recovery process and sustain the growth of the industry, PCCI is promoting greater investment in the country's healthcare systems.

Meanwhile, PCCI tourism committee chair Samie Lim highlighted the importance of public-private partnership in further reviving the country's tourism industry.

"If the public and private sector work as one, we can find the solution of bringing people from their homes to COVID-free bubble destinations through a secured travel system for a safe vacation. Safe travel routes will allow us to go on vacation again," Lim shared.

PCCI tourism co-chair Jose Mari del Rosario also highlighted that with the current rise of online meetings due to telecommuting, hotels and resorts have been bullish in promoting new rates to entice travelers to stay for longer periods while working.

In rebooting the tourism industry, PCCI fully supports the government in protecting tourists' welfare and tourist attractions through comprehensive master planning that enables the right balance between economic growth and environmental preservation.

Rtn. Jordan M. Pizarra: First, A Strong Moral Foundation

Practicing law, although meaningful and rewarding, is a tough career. Being a lawyer isn't easy, and not everyone is cut out for it. In fact, Rtn. Atty. Jordan M. Pizarra did not consider taking up law when he was young.

A Bachelor of Science in Commerce graduate, his first job was in the accounting department of a company. Determined to climb the corporate ladder, he felt he needed to take either a master's or doctorate degree to advance his career. He decided to pursue law, as also inspired by his lawyer father.

But what makes a good attorney? Besides being passionate not only about his or her job, a lawyer must be equally passionate about helping others and truly compassionate to his or her clients. Having a strong moral foundation is important, says Rtn. Jordan, in order to have a positive impact on the life of a client.



In 2003, Rtn. Jordan founded Pizarra Flores Olandesca & Associates Law, an eight-lawyer firm engaged in Appellate Litigation, Corporate Law, Civil and Criminal Laws, Banking Laws, Commercial and Credit Transactions, Taxation, Family and Domestic Law, Environmental Law, Immigration Law, among other practice areas. He also now serves as Corporate Secretary to several companies in the Philippines.

Get to know more about Rtn. Jordan as he talks about his legal practice area and the most memorable case he has handled. He also shares sound advice to an aspiring lawyer.

Rhea Vitto Tabora (RVT): Was it your dream to become a lawyer? What motivated you to go into law practice?

Jordan M. Pizarra (JMP): No. It was not my dream to become a lawyer when I was young. After college, I worked in an Accounting department of a company and then I realized that I needed to take either a Master in Business Administration or a Juris Doctor Degree for me to advance the corporate ladder.

I finally decided to take up law because of the advice of my former boss who knew that my father was a lawyer.

RVT: What do you wish you knew about practicing law before you got into it?

JMP: I wish I had immersed myself in the classics.

RVT: Which legal practice area are you into and why did you choose it?

JMP: I am into appellate law. In my first few years as a lawyer, my boss was former Supreme Court Justice Hugo E. Gutierrez, Jr. and the firm where I worked was mainly engaged in appeals before the Court of Appeals and the Supreme Court.

When I went on my own and established my law firm, I was also into appellate law and that is where I am most comfortable with.

RVT: What do you like most about practicing law?

JMP: To be able to help others is the most rewarding feeling.

RVT: Without divulging sensitive details, can you share your most interesting/memorable case?

JMP: My most memorable case involves a multi-

national company. I entered into the case when they had already lost in the Supreme Court. I was asked to file a Motion for Reconsideration.

I did not think much about it until the head of the client's legal department asked me to make a presentation before an industry-wide association. The case had a wide impact in the insurance industry. It affected the business model of the whole insurance industry.

The decision was 3-2 against them. The two justices who ruled in their favor already retired so there was no one left to defend the dissenting opinion in the decision.

The case went to the Supreme Court En Banc and the original decision was reversed. We prevailed in an almost unanimous decision.

RVT: How should lawyers/ law firms adapt to COVID-19 situation?

JMP: I think law firms and lawyers have adapted very well with the current COVID-19 situation by minimizing face-to-face meetings and utilizing the technology with online meetings and hearings.

If you could give one piece of advice to an aspiring lawyer, what would it be?

"My advice to an aspiring lawyer is to study hard, read the Bible and the classics in order to have a strong moral foundation and gain a deep understanding of human nature."

Rtn. Jordan M. Pizarra: First, A Strong Moral Foundation

RVT: What's the best thing about joining the Rotary Club of Manila? How has the Rotary journey changed you?

JMP: I have seen how Rotary Club of Manila has been a real service organization and how the members devote themselves to public service and helping the less fortunate members of the society.

This is a concrete way of obeying the command of our Lord Jesus to feed the hungry and give drink to the thirsty.

As part of our preparations for the 2021 District Conference ("DISCON") slated on 10 April 2021, please be reminded of the following:

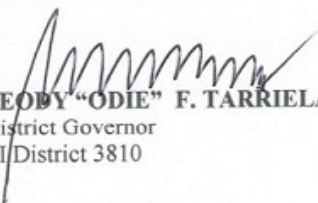

CLUB INNOVATION

The expat experience

Situated in the Thai highlands not far from Myanmar and Laos, Chiang Mai is home to around 130,000 inhabitants, and its balmy climate and low cost of living have made it a top destination for expatriates, including digital nomads and retirees. According to some estimates, there are about 40,000 expats living in the city, many of whom are from the United States.

Since 2012, Gordana Nardini, a retired English-language teacher who is originally from Croatia, has spent much of each year in Chiang Mai. She fell in love with the city, she says, because it is close to Myanmar, where she spent several years in her youth when her father worked as a trade promotion officer in the city of Yangon, and because Chiang Mai's multinational populace allows her to use many of the seven languages she speaks.

Nardini had been a member of the Rotary Club of Zagreb-Centar, Croatia, since 2000. In Thailand, she began attending meetings of the Chiang Mai International club to keep up her attendance but eventually decided to join outright. "In Croatia, my club was well established, while the club in Chiang Mai was struggling with membership," she says. "I saw that I could do so much here."

A year ago, Nardini was planning to leave northern Thailand for a few months, as many of the region's expatriates do at the beginning of what is known as the "burning season" — when farmers outside the city of Chiang Mai burn over their fields.

"We have some of the most polluted air on the face of planet Earth during burning season," says Roger Lindley, the current president and a charter member of the Chiang Mai International club. "They burn the fields and the surrounding forests for mushroom production."

But realizing that Thailand was doing much better than Europe when it came to controlling COVID-19 infections, Nardini changed her mind at the last minute. "I canceled my flight," she says.

As it turned out, many flights were canceled. In June, Nardini managed to get a rare flight out, but then she couldn't get back. Neither could five other members, who were stranded in places like Grenada, Portugal, and the U.S.

"Open access to Thailand did not exist," says John Schorr, a past club president and a retired professor of sociology at Stetson University in Florida, whose wife is from Thailand. "Many of our members chose to leave in March and April with the intention of coming back in May or June."

In April, the club began holding its regular meetings online — and those virtual meetings turned out to be a lifeline for a club that has always struggled with membership.

"Chiang Mai is a big retirement community for Westerners," says Nancy Lindley, club treasurer. Lindley and her husband, Roger, both mechanical engineers who ran a specialty greenhouse in Michigan before retiring, moved to Chiang Mai in 2008. "So we have a very transient population. There are people who are here just for a year or two. Every year we have quite a turnover in our membership, which other Thai clubs don't have to deal with."

"That's a challenge for maintaining continuity, leadership, and our sense of purpose," adds Roger Lindley. "At one point, we were at almost 50 percent turnover per year."

Recently, the club addressed the problem by instituting a special passport membership that allows people who have an interest in the club's mission, or a connection to Chiang Mai, to join whether or not they live in the city. Even after the Thai government eased its lockdown to allow in-person gatherings at reduced capacity in late June, the club waited till July to start meeting in person again. It also opted to keep one monthly Zoom meeting so that passport members, along with members stranded abroad, could attend.

The club focuses on improving children's health and education in northern Thailand, which falls under Rotary's Area of Focus, saving mother and children.

Since its beginning, the club's focus has been on improving children's health and education in northern Thailand. After chartering in 2014, the club raised funds to support a clinic that provides medical care for some of the nearly 100,000 migrants who have fled conflict between the government in Myanmar and eastern ethnic groups. Members also worked with the BEAM (Bridging Educational Access to Marginalized People) Education Foundation and started a vision screening program in local schools. But perhaps one of the club's most important projects is also one of the simplest: teaching local children how to swim. "It may not sound like an important thing," says Schorr, "but drowning is the leading cause of death for children in Thailand, more than dengue fever, more than anything else."

So far, some 2,000 kids have learned to swim through the program, which makes sure every fourth grader in Chiang Mai municipal schools gets 15 hours of swimming instruction. The program has been so successful that the Rotary Club of Patong Beach on Phuket, an island in southern Thailand, has adopted it; seven schools in the nearby Phrao district of Chiang Mai province are also participating, with the help of the club and funds from the local British community.

When they expanded the program to the Phrao district, members learned that two students had drowned there just weeks before, Roger Lindley says. "That kind of gets to you," he says. "When you think about how kids can't swim, and they're drowning in drainage ditches and canals, with one kid trying to save another, or parents trying to save their kid, you know you're doing some good. You know we're making a difference."

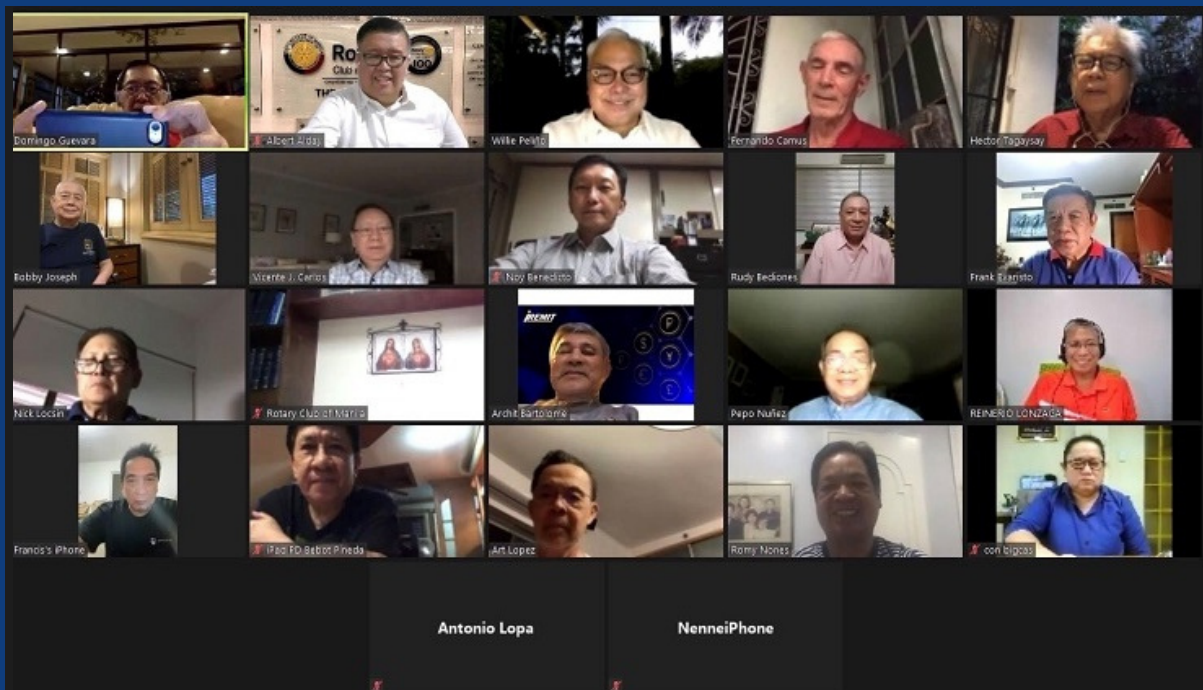
