PROFILE

PDG VINCE CARLOS



"The Champion, the best district governor in the world." That was how RI President Paolo Costa acclaimed DG Vince Carlos during the 1991 Rotary International Convention in Mexico City; and that was because DG Vince garnered 4 out of the 8 international awards conferred by Pres. Paolo at that convention, leaving the rest of the other 500+ governors around the world to vie for the remaining 4 awards.

"Leadership in Service" has been Vince's guiding principle as a Rotarian. Just as Rotarians are leaders in their own fields, they should strive to be leaders in the various avenues of Rotary service. Club, district and higher officers must strive to be good leaders of leaders.

Like his father Jonby, who raised him in the ideals of Rotary, Vince joined the Rotary Club of Manila, the premier club in Asia, in 1975 with the classification of Aviation Law. Vince also became club President in 1982-83, the second youngest in the club's history, and received the most number of awards from the District during his term. He served as District Governor of D-381 (only 3 digits then) for 1990-91 and was elected Chairman/Spokesman of his group of nine (9) District Governors in the Philippines.

Vince has maintained a 100% attendance record for all his 41 years. He has attended 31 Rotary International Conventions, most of which he helped promote among Philippine districts. He has served as a member of several R.I. Committee, task force coordinator, and as President's Special Representative to several district conferences.

In 2001-02, the R.I. Board of Directors conferred on PDG Vince the "Service Above Self" Award, Rotary's highest honor for a Rotarian. The Rotary Foundation has also given him its top awards: a "Citation for Meritorious Service" (1992) and the "Distinguished Service Award" (1998) for his exceptional record of service to The Foundation. He was accorded the "Serving Beyond Your Year" Award by the Philippine College of Rotary Governors.

A Major Donor and Benefactor of The Rotary Foundation, he has also sponsored the PHF contributions of his wife and four children. His wife, Tina, as a true Rotary partner, served as President of the Inner Wheel Club of Manila and, later, as Past Inner Wheel District Chairperson of District 381.

Vince served as Secretary of Tourism under President Fidel V. Ramos from 1992 to 1995. He is Honorary Consul of Cote d'Ivoire in the Philippines, a past Dean of the Consular Corps of the Philippines and is the first and only Director from the Philippines in the World Federation of Consuls (FICAC), where he represents the East Asia region.

Other interesting highlights of PDG Vince Carlos' career.

- ❖ Vince attended his first District Assembly at Zamboanga City (when the Philippines was just one district) at the early age of 10, where his father headed the Rotary Club of Manila delegation as Incoming President for Rotary Year 1956-1957. He and his father holds the distinction as the only father and son who became presidents of RCM in its 93 years of existence.
- ❖ He gives generously of his resources (being a Major Donor and a Benefactor of The Rotary Foundation) but, even better, has the knack of making hundreds of others give generously as well. During his governorship, he broke previous district records by raising US\$290,314.11 for The Rotary Foundation, the highest of all nine districts in the Philippines and one of the highest over-all during that year.
- ❖ During his two term (1997-'98 & 2000-'01) as Chairman of the D-3810 Coordinating Committee for The Rotary Foundation, he was able to raise a record of over US\$505,000 in Paul Harris contributions. In spite of the prevailing economic difficulties in the Philippines in 1997-1998, his district landed among the top six contributors worldwide, surpassed only by some U.S. and Japanese districts.
- ❖ He raised PHP2,497,859.93 (then worth US\$99,914.40) from local and 8 foreign districts for emergency relief during the 1990 earthquake that devastated Central and Northern Luzon. For long-term reconstruction, P1M was used from this to found the Tarlac Rotary Health Center (D-3790) and the Santiago Rotary Multi-Purpose Center (D-3770), which was inaugurated by then R.I. Past Director and later President Bhichai Rattakul.

- ❖ As Governor, Vince was able to increase district membership from 2,892 to 3,099 Rotarians at yearend, the biggest in the Philippines.
- ❖ He was the delegate of District 3810 to the 2001 Council on Legislation which met in Chicago, Illinois, USA.
- ❖ He was appointed as a Director of the Public Relations Committee by RIP Cliff Dochterman, a member of the R.I. Extension Committee by RIP Bhichai Rattakul, as Vice Chairman for Philippine Polio Eradication Fundraising Campaign Committee by Rotary Foundation Chairman Glen Kinross, and as Water Resource Zone Task Force Coordinator by RIP Wilf Wilkinson and RIP D.K. Lee.
- ❖ For many years, he has campaigned participation by Philippine districts in the annual Rotary International Conventions and coordinated the Asia Pacific Breakfast Fellowship that has become a regular sidelight of RI Conventions.
- ❖ Vince is a recipient of hundreds of awards and citations from Rotary Clubs, Rotary Districts, Rotary International, The Rotary Foundation and other organizations and agencies, with major ones already cited earlier. Among his other significant awards and citations include:
 - Awarded by King Juan Carlos I of Spain the Spanish Condecoracion of "Gran Cruz de la Orden del Merito Civil" in 1995;
 - Awarded by H.E. Philippine President Fidel V. Ramos the Presidential Award Medal of Merit in 1998;
 - Awarded by the Republic of Cote d'Ivoire the decoration of "Chevailier d'Orden National" in 2009;
 - Awarded by World Federation of Consuls President Arnold Foote the FICAC Medal of Honor and its highest award-the FICAC Medal of Excellence in 2010.
 - Awarded by World Federation of Consuls President Aykut Eken the FICAC Award of Distinction in 2017.

"Everyday is God's day. Share and serve."

Consul General Robert Lim Joseph, or Bobby to family and friends, is a living miracle. He was given six months to one year and a half to live because of his kidney cancer that was discovered in 2002 which later progressed to Stage 4 renal cell carcinoma in 2007.

Today, Bobby remains optimistic despite his lingering illness and pain. He is surrounded by the love and support of his wife, Ida, five children, and four amiable grandsons. Bobby was born on December 12, 1949 to parents of Arab, Spanish, Chinese, and Filipino descent. He attributes his business acumen to being Chinese, his passion and drive to being Arab and Spanish, and his discipline and frugality to being Ilocano. As he fondly puts it, "I am a 'fruit cocktail' but my heart and soul is Filipino."

In spite of holding the position as chairman of Philippine Wine Merchants, Ralphs Wines and Spirits, and Coltrans Cargo, Bobby chooses to focus on his volunteer work to promote tourism. He is the Director and Chair of the Rotary Club of Manila Tourism Committee. He co-organized the Tourism Educators and Movers Philippines (Team Philippines), League of Tourism Students of the Philippines (LTSP), and Network of Independent Travel and Allied Services Philippines Inc. (NITAS). He is currently the chair of SKAL International Makati, an international organization of top executives representing all branches of the travel and tourism industry. Furthermore, he participates in Gawad Kalinga's social tourism program, Save our Skies, and Fair Open Skies.

He has written several books, including Guide to Global VIP's, Bring Out the Best, and M.I.C.E. (Meetings, Incentives, Conventions, Events and Exhibitions).

He chairs the weekly 777 News Forum in Manila since 2005 and the 888 News Forum in Cebu since 2006. He is a member of the Manila Overseas Press Club.

DDCC/IPP BOBBY JOSEPH



Bobby travels all over the country conducting seminars promoting the culture of tourism, values formation towards leadership, diplomacy, protocol and etiquette, and other relevant tourism topics.

He is well known in the speaking circuit being usually invited as a motivational speaker for cancer patients and during big conventions in the tourism and education sectors.

He is outspoken and always makes public his strong stance in the fields of aviation and tourism and has been fighting for fairness, his advocacy since he entered the airline industry in 1969. He organized the biggest micro enterprises network through cooperativism in travel and tourism as well as networking and education of the non-IATA (International Air Transport Association) travel agents in the country since 1998 - 2015 .

Bobby's efforts and selfless dedication to the upliftment of the tourism and travel industry did not go unnoticed by award-giving bodies and his peers as shown by his numerous awards and plaques of appreciation since he had cancer. Among his latest awards and recognition were the prestigious Rotary Club of Manila's Leon Lambert Award 2015, People Asia Magazine's "Men Who Matter in Tourism 2015," Bulong Pulungan's Exemplar Award for Tourism in 2012, which was given in the presence of President Benigno "Noynoy" Aquino III, and Cebu Chamber of Commerce's first Tourism Man of the Year Award. He was made an adopted son of the province of Cebu in 2012 and was bestowed the Award of Merit, the highest award given by the province. He was honored with a doctorate degree honoris causa by the International Academy of Management and Economics in 2008.

He became the Commodore of Manila Yacht Club from 2018-2020.

Recently, he was awarded as the Outstanding President of Rotary Club of Manila year 2020-2021 and also the most Outstanding Overall President of District 3810 among 116 Rotary Clubs for year 2020-2021.

Bobby says he takes it one day at a time, beginning it by being grateful to God for giving him another day of challenge and accomplishment.

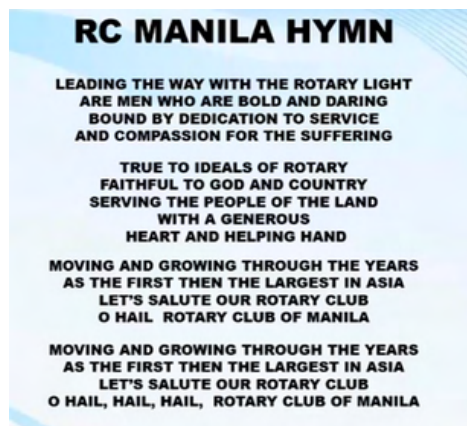

THE LOWDOWN FROM U.P.'S LEGAL LITERATI.

"I prefer to focus on finding, in this University, a common ground, a clearing — a safe, free, and congenial space within which its constituents can teach, study, and work productively to their full potential. U.P. must be that special place within which it should still be possible — despite all divisions and distractions — to work together with the University's and the nation's strategic interests in mind." — University of the Philippines President Danilo L. Concepcion

Delighted to finally meet the accomplished agriculture ace-turned-legendary legal luminary-turned-adroit academician; none other than the multi-hyphenate Danilo L. Concepcion, better known by his moniker, "DaniCon," at the Rotary Club of Manila's General Membership Meeting where he was the guest-of-honor and speaker. To the man with whom the mantle of leadership of the University of the Philippines (U.P.) was passed on as its 21st president, assuming the national university's highest post is likely to be the highlight of his life's work. Following an illustrious career as a lawyer, a youth leader and an academic, President DaniCon realizes that this singular honor of leading the country's premier state university carries with it not only the challenge to showcase the best of the Filipino people, but also the obligation to work for the betterment of the Filipino nation; indeed, being U.P. President is the capstone of a lifetime of aspiration to serve his country and people.

From his heady days as an academic achiever, President DaniCon has since embraced a culture of excellence throughout his life. He graduated with a degree in Agricultural Engineering, Summa Cum laude, from the De La Salle Araneta University in 1979. He obtained his LL.B. from the UP College of Law in 1983 with Cum Laude honors and his LL.M. from the University of London in 1986 as a Chevening Scholar. A student leader, he was elected member of the *Batasang Pambansa* in 1978 and served until 1984 as a representative of the youth sector. He also served in various capacities for the government including his appointment as Associate Commissioner of the Securities and Exchange Commission (1996-2000), and Chief-of-Staff of the Office of the Presidential Legal Counsel (1996), among others. He was later appointed as President of the De La Salle Araneta University from 2000-2002 before returning to University of the Philippines Diliman to teach at the College of Law.

With a vision to lead U.P. in fulfilling service that is true to its slogan, "honor and excellence," but more importantly with compassion, President DaniCon commenced his term with a determined effort to include "*malasakit*" as his administration's core virtue. Just two years into his presidency, he managed to raise the bar of academic excellence with prudent management of public resources and raising funds from generous donor-alumni. To date, U.P. is now the fourth best university in Southeast Asia, surging past six higher education institutions in the region in the latest Asian university rankings released by London-based Times Higher Education for 2018. Moreover, from 156th last year, the University jumped 61 places in the latest rankings of over 400 universities in Asia, entering the top 100 for the first time at 95th place. Under President DaniCon's leadership, U.P. currently ranks among the top 150 universities in the world for English language and literature and in the top 250 faculties around the world for social sciences and management.

Of course, heading a university that had come to represent the greatest intellectual activity of the nation and to where the best young Filipinos have annually flocked to avail of quality professional training offered nowhere else in the country was not without its share of controversies: his

promulgation involving the recent cases of intellectual dishonesty among two graduating students; the U.P. Board of Regents' alleged eschewing of "due process" involving the most current appointment of deans in two colleges; and the "LonsiLeaks" scandal where a series of utterly deplorable misogynistic chat messages involving members of his fraternity were leaked online, among others.

Yet, it has been said that the acts of great leaders loom larger in retrospect; in President DaniCon's case, despite having manifested great leadership throughout his yet-to-be-completed tenure, his most defining moments — which should command our respect and admiration — are yet to come. At the end of the day, his hopes and fears, mundane and otherwise, will always have some undefinable resonance in the consciousness of anyone who has some feeling for U.P. through his capacity to inspire, motivate and persuade.

And whether he will have succeeded in breaking new ground — introducing reform in differing fashion that brooked no dissent; breaking with tradition in pursuit of his goals; attempting to comb out the complexity of existing procedures of half-way measures; or mobilizing democratic energies and faith against higher authority or odds of crushing complexity — it will no longer matter.

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For simply having the courage to translate his vision for the University, President DaniCon has already written himself in its history as a public hero who had an instinct for the future of U.P. and the national purpose. Since his days as a member of the UP Diliman College of Law faculty where he served as Dean (2011-2017), as Associate Dean (2002-2006), as Head of the UP Law Center (2002-2006), as the Vice President for Legal Affairs and the UP BGC Campus' Executive Director, he has already demonstrated steadfastness, creativity and resourcefulness, fetching humanity, humility and forbearance, but also indomitable courage and integrity, never pandering to his myriad of critics or to the opposition.

And for all his accomplishments, President DaniCon has kept his self-effacing countenance and light-hearted sense of humor largely intact. Chided by a Rotarian-Atenean during a Question-and-Answer portion of his talk about the UP Fighting Maroons' most gleaming exclusion from the final round of this year's UAAP Basketball Tournament, he deadpanned with a hilarious quip: "I am not bothered by U.P.'s exclusion from this year's finals; after all, as with all bright students, they are normally exempted from the finals."

And, for a fellow U.P. alumnus like me, this is what makes President DaniCon especially endearing.
