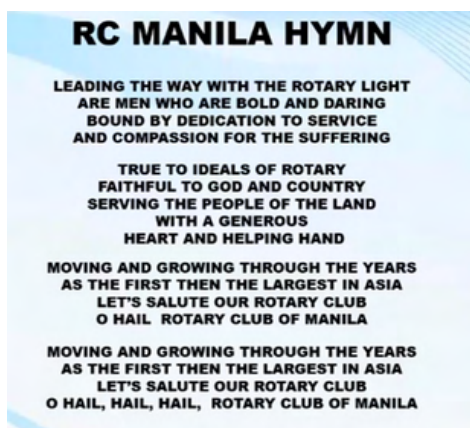

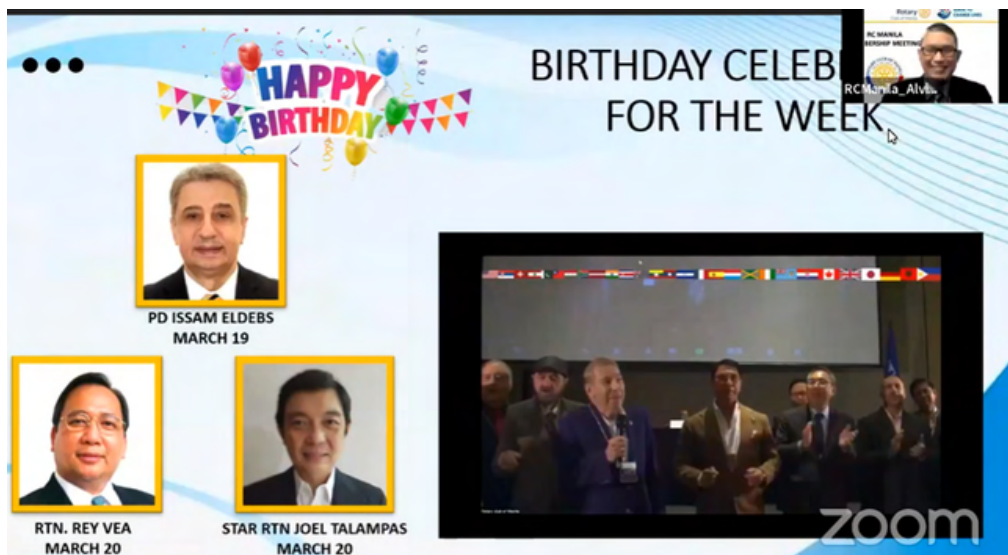

Remembering Lolo Monching

Last March 17, 2022 was the 65th death anniversary of the one and only “Guy,” my Lolo, President Ramon Magsaysay.

I’ve visited Mt. Manunggal, the site of his plane crash in 1957, several times, even if I’ve never met him, having been born in 1968. He was called “Monching,” by those he was close to.

For my dad Ramon Jr. and Tita Mila Magsaysay-Valenzuela, his surviving children, it’s a very different story. For them, it’s always a painful reminder of the time when their father died so unexpectedly, 65 years ago.

We go there to that sad and evocative mountain eerie each time to honor his memory. Not many people today know how my grandfather upheld his life as a public servant and a Filipino.



The youth today, especially, should understand that our leaders should be held accountable for their behavior in office. This was a non-negotiable issue for my grandfather, I have been told many times. No one reflected this profile as did Lolo. Since we will have an election in a few months, we should make sure the people we vote for are of a certain moral standing.

Lolo, I believe, said it so rightly and timelessly in his Magsaysay Credo:

“I believe that government starts at the bottom and moves upward, for government exists for the welfare of the masses of the nation... I believe that he who has less in life should have more in law...I believe that this nation is endowed with a vibrant and stout heart, and possesses untapped capabilities and incredible resiliency... I believe that a high and unwavering sense of morality should pervade all spheres of governmental activity...”

I hope that Lolo would not have died in vein on that chilly mountain top, and that the words of a most extraordinary public servant continue to ring true with the next generation.

Broaden your connections and discover the positive impact of DEI

Interview with Todd “Bowtie” Jenkins – Rotary Club of Fayetteville, Arkansas – Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Task Force member.

1. You have worked with such companies as Walmart, Google, Facebook, American Airlines, and Kellogg’s. What can Rotary learn from these companies regarding DEI?

There is no one right way or one-size-fits-all to make DEI (diversity, equity, and inclusion) work. As individuals and as an organization, we must understand that we are all on a journey. These big companies have done a great job of understanding the business case for practicing DEI — that the most diverse companies are more likely than ever to outperform less-diverse peers. Rotary must use its connections to continue to activate an inclusive growth-mindset and become something the world hasn’t seen before — an organization where inclusion is at the core of everything we think, say, or do.

2. You speak to Rotary clubs and districts worldwide about DEI. Are there frequent questions you hear, and how do you address them?

There are certainly some common themes. One common question is: “Where do we start?” This is a great first question. It is vital to assess your community, where you are at, and understand where you wish to go. Then, most important, build a plan to get there, and live out your plan in behaviors and actions.

Another question is: “How do we connect with diverse communities?” This one should be so easy for Rotary because connection is all about building relationships — authentic relationships! Get to know people who are different from you, and partner with marginalized communities through service projects or meaningful events.

A third, frequent question is: “How do we get buyin?” This is where it is so important to make sure that DEI efforts extend to all activities and involve everyone. Make sure there is a commitment to the work at the highest levels of the club and district, and if you can, make sure all the goals have measurable results.

3. As more clubs and districts work to set up specific committees to address DEI, what advice do you have for them?

Don't shy away from having hard conversations, but make sure you are able to answer two questions: Whom will this conversation benefit, and what are we looking to accomplish? We all come to these efforts differently, so we need to create spaces to listen and ask tough questions around representation, culture, systems, policies, and programs, all while avoiding the tendency toward shame and blame. I have learned to practice curiosity with compassion — looking to understand different views and perspectives. The more we practice these traits, the better we will become.

4. How optimistic are you for the future of diversity, equity, and inclusion within Rotary?

Hope is all we have, and it is part of why I believe Rotary is ready to do the work. Rotary brings hope every day to communities around the world. This work and commitment are not meant to always be exhausting. Yes, you will have challenging times and conversations. However, I have seen in my profession that small changes in DEI work can make a big difference. You should celebrate the small wins. COVID-19 has taught us so many lessons, including that of gratitude. So don't forget to smile and enjoy the process of doing the right thing.

FAMILY BUSINESS GURU.

"Never put business before family." – Walter Elias Disney

When it comes to advice about family businesses, one would normally expect it to come from his relatives or friends who also own family businesses, since it can be assumed that they're the ones who will understand his situation better due to similar experience. However, some might occasionally have to seek the advice of a professional consultant; and there are family business experts like Dr. QUEENA LEE-CHUA who are the master of their craft.

Dr. Lee-Chua best describes her passion to share and spread the value of understanding science both inside and outside the lecture hall. Numerous books, articles, lectures, columns, and other communication tools in her name mirror a vastly creative and disciplined persona.

Born on April 13, 1966, Lee-Chua's list of accomplishments and activities stretches out to prolific frontier. She has written science and math books, a newspaper column, and teaches both subjects to students, parents, media, and practically everybody else. But she remains consistent in her goal to make science and math learning "fun" through "simpler, more understandable language." She brings the "fun" to print, radio, TV, online, and interpersonal audiences.

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Dr. Lee-Chua graduated summa cum laude at Ateneo de Manila University with the program of BS Mathematics. She then went on to pursue a master's degree in Counselling Psychology, and a doctorate degree in Clinical Psychology from the same university, where she now works as a full-time professor, teaching courses like Modern Mathematics and General Psychology among others.

A licensed psychologist, she writes the "All in the Family" column for the Philippine Daily Inquirer and has authored books on math, popular science, education, parenting, family and teen issues, mental health, family businesses, inspirational stories. She used to host the TV show "Fun with Math" on PTV 4. She also headed Ateneo teams that studied the best practices of Filipino public and private school achievers, and the media and gadget habits of Filipino youth.

A board member, speaker, and consultant for schools, government, civic groups, and family businesses, she also consults for the Department of Education, and the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) and sits on the board of business

and academe. During this pandemic, she has conducted several webinars for students, parents, teachers, civil groups, businesses, on online teaching and learning, resilience and mental health, math and science, best practices of family businesses, financial literacy, among others.

On top of that, Dr. Lee-Chua is the recipient of many awards, including The Outstanding Women in the Nation's Service [2001], Outstanding Young Scientist [National Academy of Science and Technology, 2002], First Multiple Intelligence Award [Dr. Howard Gardner, Multiple Intelligence International School Foundation, Inc., 2005], Outstanding Teacher Award [Metrobank Foundation, 2003], National Book Award for Science [2003], Carlos Palanca Memorial Awards for Literature [1st place, English Essay, 2001], S&T Journalism Awards [Philippine Press Institute-Philippine Geothermal Inc., 1992], and DOST-Best S&T Columnist, special citation [2005].

She is currently full professor at the Mathematics Department of ADMU. And, for two years running, she was voted Most Legendary Teacher by Ateneo students themselves.
