HISTORY

OF THE RCMANILA FOUNDATION, INC.

RELATIONSHIP OF RCMANILA FOUNDATION, INC. AND THE ROTARY CLUB OF MANILA

The RCManila Foundation, Inc. and the Rotary Club of Manila are two separate and distinct entities. The RCManila Foundation, Inc. is an incorporated foundation while the Rotary Club of Manila is a *societas anonimas*, a kind of unincorporated association with a distinct legal personality. The foundation, in accordance with PCNC requirements, should have its own projects. Funding of projects of the Rotary Club of Manila may be undertaken as an ancillary activity subject to availability of funds after allocation of funds for the institutional projects of the foundation. Members of the Rotary Club of Manila can opt to become members of the foundation by way of payment of the membership admission fee of Php 5,000.00. Likewise, the nine (9) Members of the Board of Directors of the Rotary Club of Manila are automatically nominated to the Board of Trustees of the RCManila Foundation, Inc. together with six (6) others nominated from the members of the foundation during the annual election of the Board of Trustees to make the fifteen (15) total members of the Board of Trustees. The Chairman and the President of the RCManila Foundation, Inc., in turn, sit as Ex-Officio Members of the Board of Directors of the Rotary Club of Manila by virtue of a Board Resolution of the club in RY 2019-2020. The RCManila Foundation, Inc. shares the same office and consequently, the same office address as the Rotary Club of Manila. Thus, the relationship of both organizations is at arms length, so to speak.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The seeds of the RCManila Foundation can be traced back to 1975 when it was conceptualized by well-meaning members of the Rotary Club of Manila with the end in view of funding the projects of the Rotary Club of Manila. However, it was only in 1979 that the Foundation was incorporated with the Securities and Exchange Commission with PDG Benny Angtuaco as Chairman and Fr. Frank Reyes as President during the term of Rotary Club of Manila President Alberto "Bert" Romulo. It was registered in the Social Security System as Rotary Club of Manila Foundation, Inc. on October 25, 1990. From its inception, several projects had been planned which included a proposed RCManila Foundation Community Service Center Building along a city property on Vito Cruz Street corner Maytubig Street in Manila, the sublease of the Ground Floor of which was granted on October 17, 1991 during the term of RCManila Foundation, Inc. President PDG Romy del Rosario, and a four storey Social Housing Project on Juan Luna St., Tondo, Manila in RY 1993-1994. This was the prevailing norm of undertaking activities for several years until a foundation found national prominence when it hugged the limelight as it served as a conduit for siphoning funds which prompted the national government to craft and impose stringent rules on the setting up as well as documentary requirements in the registration and operations of foundations.

HISTORY

OF THE RCMANILA FOUNDATION, INC.

In the light of these events which overtook the otherwise smooth and seamless flow of operations in the past, the RCManila Foundation first applied for accreditation with the then newly created, Philippine Council for NGO Certification (PCNC), the certifying body of Philippine Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) in 1998. However, this first attempt for accreditation served as a learning experience for the foundation as its application was denied due to the absence of its own activities and insufficient funds.

During RY 2004-2005, the Board of Directors of the Rotary Club of Manila signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the RCManila Foundation, Inc. to transfer project funds that were underutilized to the RCManila Foundation, Inc. on loan for the purpose of representing it as funds of the Foundation in furtherance of PCNC accreditation.

In RY 2006-2007, a Policy on Conflict of Interest was crafted, signed by then RCManila Foundation, Inc. President Alex Yap and by then Secretary Monte Montecillo. It was not until August of 2007 that then PD Pat Vilorio sought the Amendment of the By-Laws and the Articles of Incorporation through the auspices of the Saludo Agpalo Fernandez and Aquino Law Office of PP Aniceto "Dong" Saludo. Forthwith, the said law office extended help pro bono in amending the By-Laws and Articles of Incorporation during RY 2008-2009.

The Board of Trustees of RY 2010-2011 considered applying for accreditation again with PCNC. However, it was not until RY 2015-2016 when the foundation made headway with the hiring of an experienced staff by the name of Shirley Fajarito to help in the process of obtaining the PCNC accreditation of which the foundation came as far as obtaining a Certificate of Registration from the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) as the staff left for another employment. Ardent pursuits for the accreditation in RY 2017-2018 fell in vain.

A breakthrough, however, was forthcoming in RY 2018-2019 when Chairman Rob Sears contracted the services of an experienced lady by the name of Caridad Basila, a Certified Public Accountant and a PCNC Assessor, who undertook necessary paperwork which resulted in the renewal of its Certificate of Registration and the obtaining of a Certificate of License to Operate from the DSWD together with the much coveted accreditation from the PCNC as well as the foundation's Donee's Tax Exemption from the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR). During the RY 2019-2020, the foundation submitted the amendment to the Articles of Incorporation to the SEC in order to change the address of the RCManila Foundation, Inc. and to conform to the PCNC requirement that the administrative expenses of the organization, on an annual basis, shall not exceed 30% of total donations and of total expenditures for the taxable year. This happened last February 20, 2020.

HISTORY

OF THE RCMANILA FOUNDATION, INC.

An ailing Chairman Rob Sears, turned over the Chairmanship to IPVP Herminio Esguerra, who, with the untimely resignation of certain members of the Board of Trustees which created a vacancy in the positions of President, Secretary, Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer, quickly filled the vacancies with the conformity of the Board of Trustees in RY 2020-2021 and hired a new dedicated staff, Mirasol Troniado-Encarnacion, to pursue the PCNC re-accreditation which expired in December of 2020 with the end in mind of finally obtaining the Donors Tax Exemption status with the Bureau of Internal Revenue. Meanwhile, the amendment to the Articles of Incorporation of the foundation submitted in February of 2020 was only granted by the SEC in October of 2020 due to the lockdown brought about by the global pandemic. After going through the interview processes of PCNC earlier in 2021 and after the onslaught of the global pandemic that resulted in lockdowns where the PCNC's operations were hampered in 2020, the foundation reclaimed its PCNC accreditation valid for one year last February 24, 2021 and after constant follow ups with the BIR, finally, reached a milestone in obtaining its Certificate of Registration for its Donors Tax Exempt status last May 10, 2021. Hence, five of the members of the Board of Trustees of the foundation attended the 22nd PCNC General Assembly last June 1, 2021. Thereafter, the foundation obtained a second renewal of its PCNC Accreditation last February 22, 2022 where it was bestowed an accreditation of three (3) years. The foundation is now poised to move forward in its activities.

President PDG Romy del Rosario, then Manila Mayor Gemiliano "Mel" Lopez" granted the request of the foundation to sublease the entire Ground Floor of the multi-storey building proposed to be put up by the foundation as the RCManila Foundation Community Service Center on a city property under lease to the foundation, located at Vito Cruz St. corner Maytubig St. in Manila.

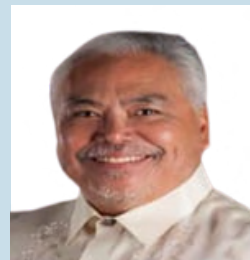

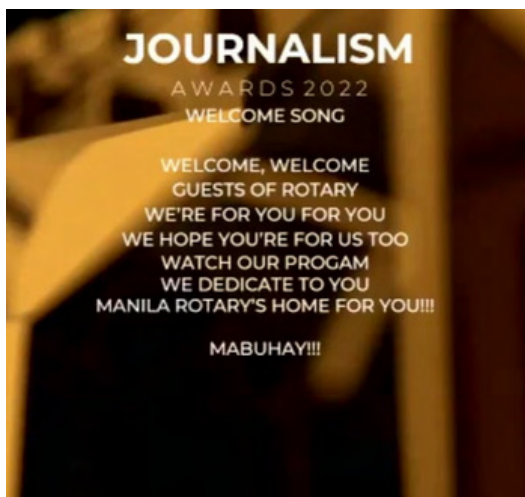

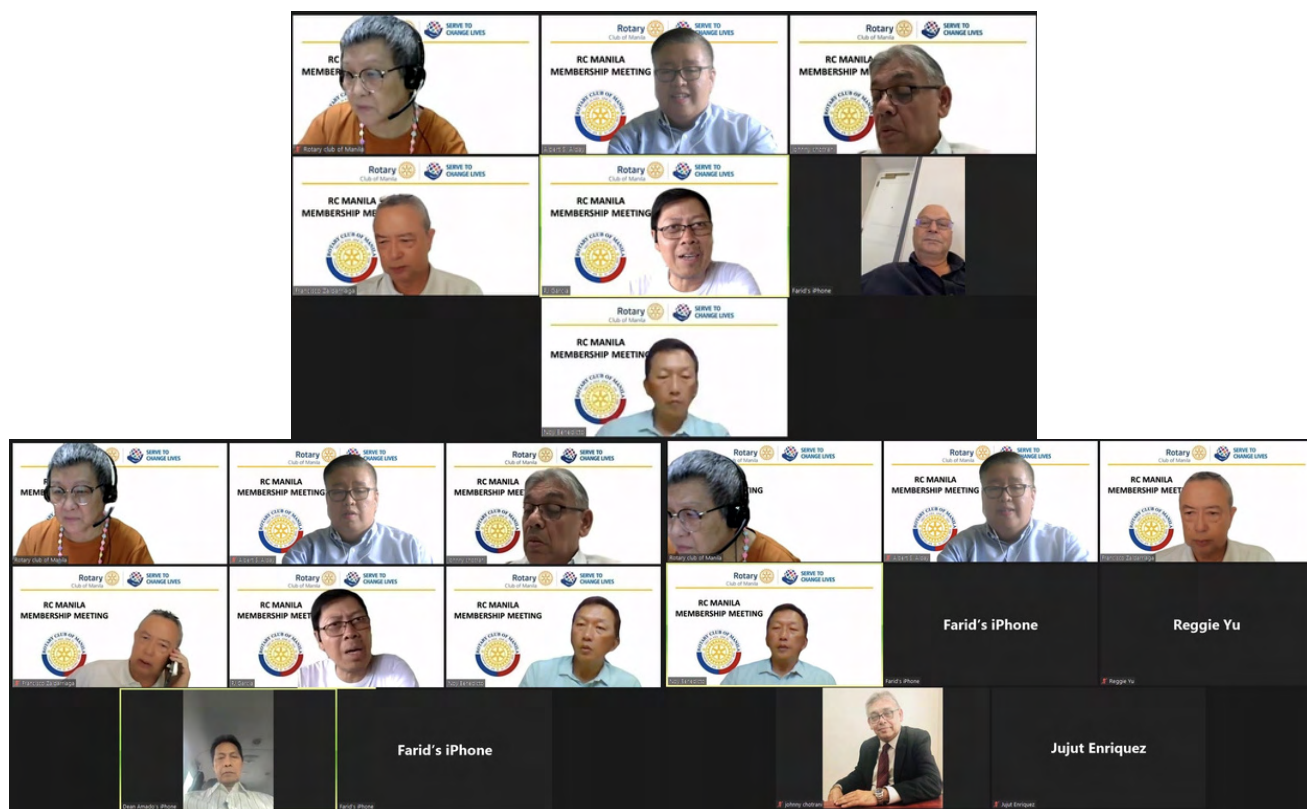

Ida, Robi, Ria, Rizza, Ralph and everyone of Bobby's family members as well as my RCM brothers who are all here this afternoon, my deepest, deepest sympathies to all of you.

It's really very hard to put into words my sentiments about this man, a man who deeply touched the lives of all who he came across and met.

Bobby had a way of connecting with people unlike anyone I've known.

He was always available for anyone who needed to talk or consult him on matters about anything especially about RCM. Text him "can I call?" He would call you!

His Rotary term was rife with hard and extremely difficult decisions to make - but decide he did and he did so with firmness, but tempered with kindness and dignity.

His generosity was legendary. You heard Anton, Sam, Francis Nagi, Amading... We've all witnessed his magnanimity...

I was sitting next to him during our recent Tourism Awards at some point before the program ended. 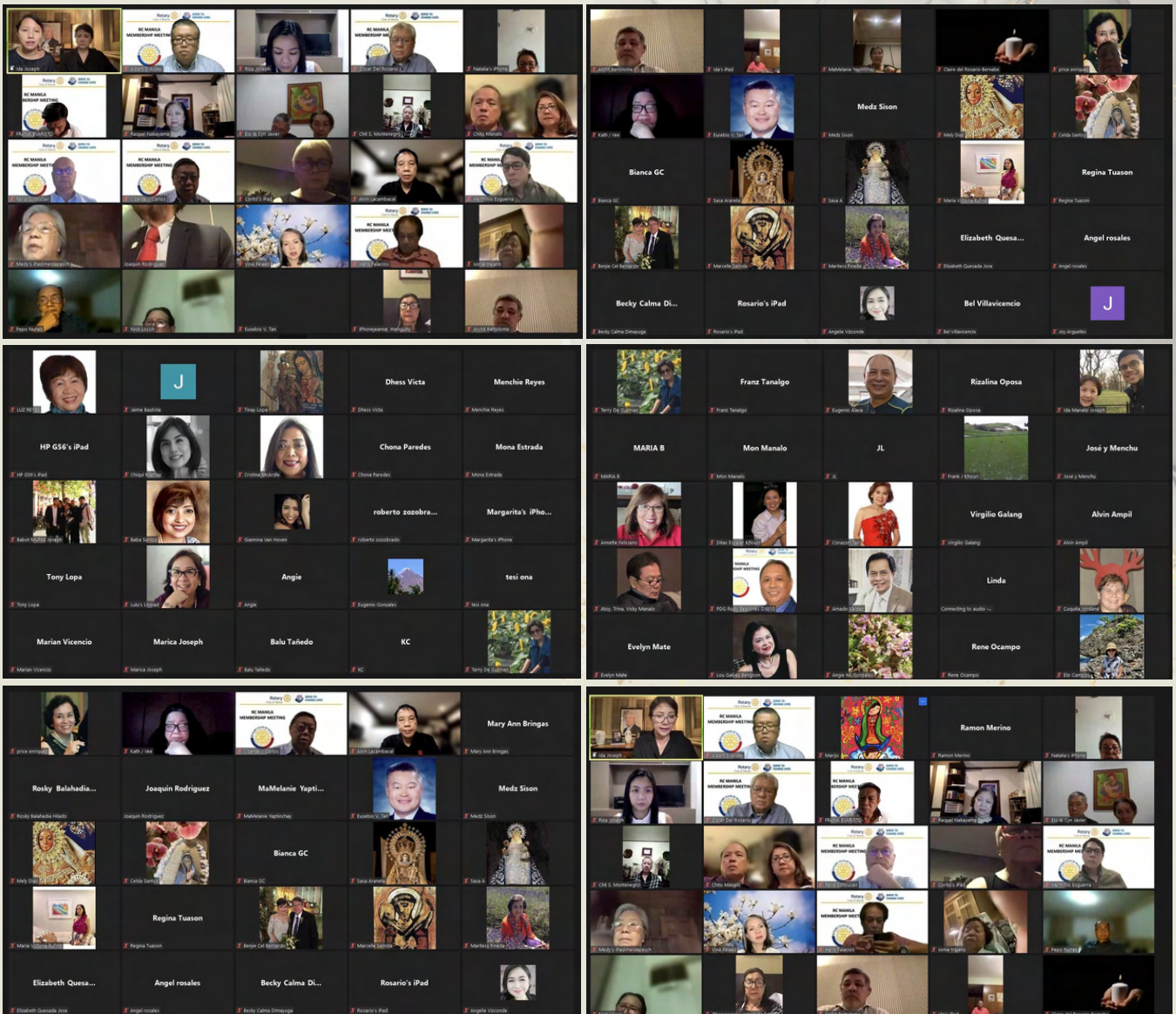

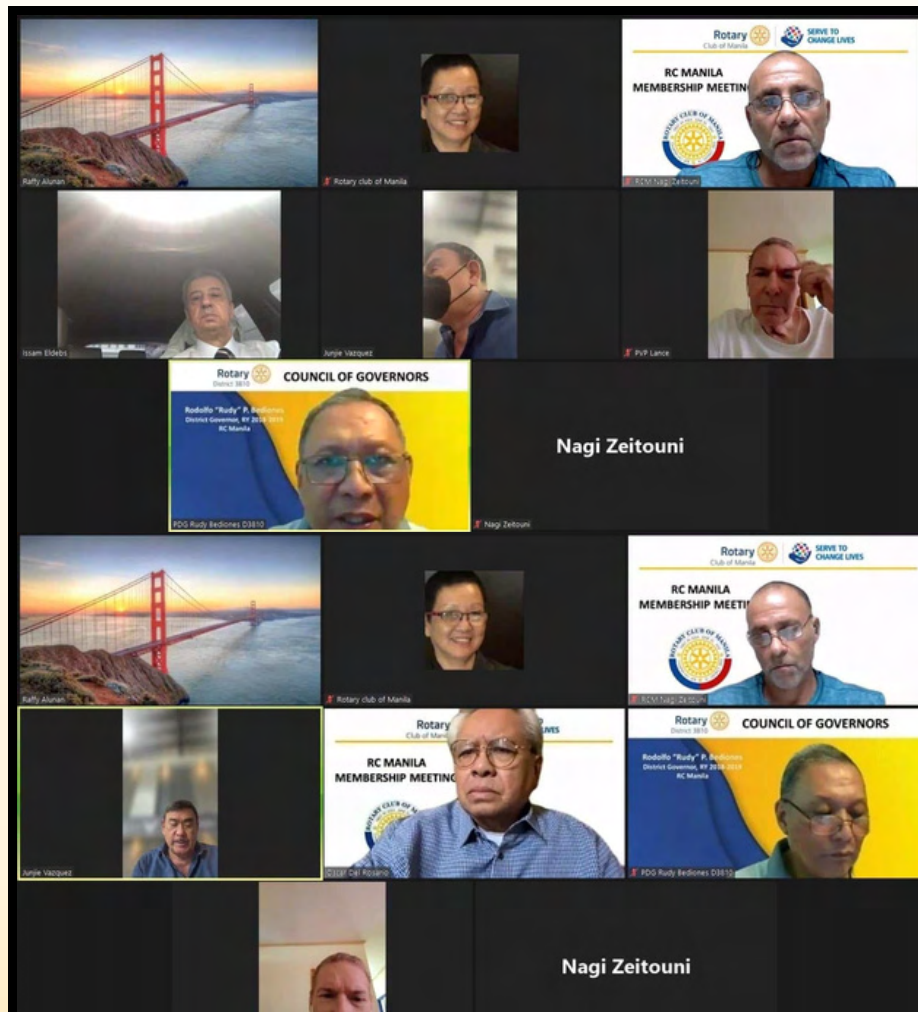

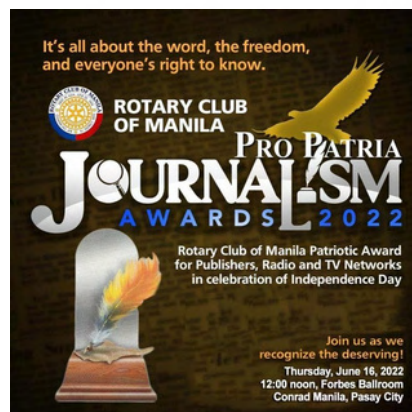

RCM Achievement Award

Last week, I got an e-mail from the Rotary Club of Manila that I'd be awarded on June 16, 2022 (Thursday) the LIFE ACHIEVEMENT AWARD AS OUTSTANDING JOURNALIST in the 2022 RCM Journalism Awards.

Honestly, I had mixed feelings on reading the RCM letter. I was not only surprised in my twilight years that a very prestigious organization like the RCM would remember and take notice of me as a journalist of over 70 years.

During its more than 100 years of existence, it has on its roster prominent personalities and leaders of the academe, business and government notably President Fidel V. Ramos and United Nations' First Asian President Carlos P. Romulo.

In RCM's letter to me, it cited Benjamin Franklin's words: "What does it take for a journalist not to be forgotten. Either write things worth reading or do things worth the writing. Emil Jurado did both.

"His work — reporting, writing a column, teaching future journalists — all done in every exemplary way would not risk a reversal by posterity's critical assessment with the benefit of hindsight. His genius lies in the freedom of thought with the guidance of conscience that characterize his life."

The citation said "the corridors of power were his hunting ground, his presence a sword of Damocles to those with ill intentions. The opportunity allowed him to accumulate wisdom from those who thought along parallel lines with him and even those with the opposites.

"He mixed all these in one brew and imparted them to his students and younger journalists — the totality of his experiences his gift to them. His lifetime is his legacy to the world."

Indeed as far as I am concerned, journalism is a "calling".

The road never ends until I write "30."

To the Rotary Club of Manila, my eternal gratitude for such an honor. I really treasure it especially at this time of my twilight years.

My thanks goes especially to RCM President Felix Francisco Zaldarriaga and to Amado Valdez, chairman of the RCM Journalism Awards and to all the directors and members of RCM. I hope and pray that I am really worth the award.

With this Life Achievement Award as Outstanding in Journalism, I cannot but reminisce how I became a journalist.

Frankly, my ambition in life was to be a lawyer and perhaps a jurist someday.

My eldest brother, Desi, was a lawyer and a justice of the Court of Appeals.

My other brother, Willie, was also a lawyer but became a businessman.

We all got it from our parents whose lifelong ambition was to have a doctor in the family and a lawyer.

It seemed every Ilocano family's ambition in life is to have at least one doctor and one lawyer in the family. Well, our parents had three lawyers and one doctor, my eldest sister.

When I was finishing my Bachelor of Arts course at the old Ateneo de Manila at Padre Faura, I was also taking selective subjects in law.

During my third and fourth year in my AB course, I was also associate editor of the Guidon, the college organ which made me familiar with editing and closing the pages of the school organ.

Thus, after our graduation in 1950, an Oblate priest, Fr. Cuttbert Billman from Cotabato City, came to the Ateneo, seeking to find volunteers to handle the "Mindanao Cross," a weekly paper of the OMI (Oblates of Mary Immaculate) that was circulated throughout Mindanao, but mostly the Notre Dame schools and colleges.

Santa Banana, I could not believe it, but "The Mindanao Cross" had a weekly circulation of 178,000, more than many of the mainstream newspapers in Manila.

Thus, it was only natural that Rudy Tupas, the Guidon's editor-in-chief and I volunteered to go to Cotabato City. We had a two-year contract. That became my acid test as a journalist. But, at that time, I still wanted to become a lawyer.

After my two-year contract, I came back to Manila to continue my law studies, but at the same time was teaching at the old Ateneo High School at Loyola Heights.

After I passed the Bar, I was taken as junior partner at Salonga and Padilla Law Office, which I thought would be a permanent job.

But, it seemed God had other plans for me when an opportunity came for me to be hired at the defunct Philippine Herald in 1957 as Business Editor.

That began my real-to-goodness career in journalism which I never left.

I am still pounding on my old Olympia typewriter (I never learned to use the computer, which makes me jurassic in many ways.)

I also got into broadcasting when I was hired by the Kanlaon Broadcasting System.

Come to think of it, I never left journalism and I am now in my twilight years.

It is for this reason why I believe journalism is more than a profession. It is a "calling". This is why I treasure the RCM award because it gives meaning to my calling as a journalist.

I co-founded the Manila Standard back in February 1987, with my good friend Rod Reyes. I have never left the Standard despite some openings in other publications.

I will stay on with The Manila Standard till I write "30."

Truth, fairness, justice, honor and integrity are things a real journalist must live for, or even die for.

Journalism, as I always say, is a reward in itself. "It's a calling," as the 95-year-old Mr. Jurado said. But to be recognized in these exhausting times is a bonus.

Thank you Rotary Club of Manila for the recognition. It's an honor to be in this profession and to stand with fellow journalists on that stage last week. A great day for journalism, indeed.

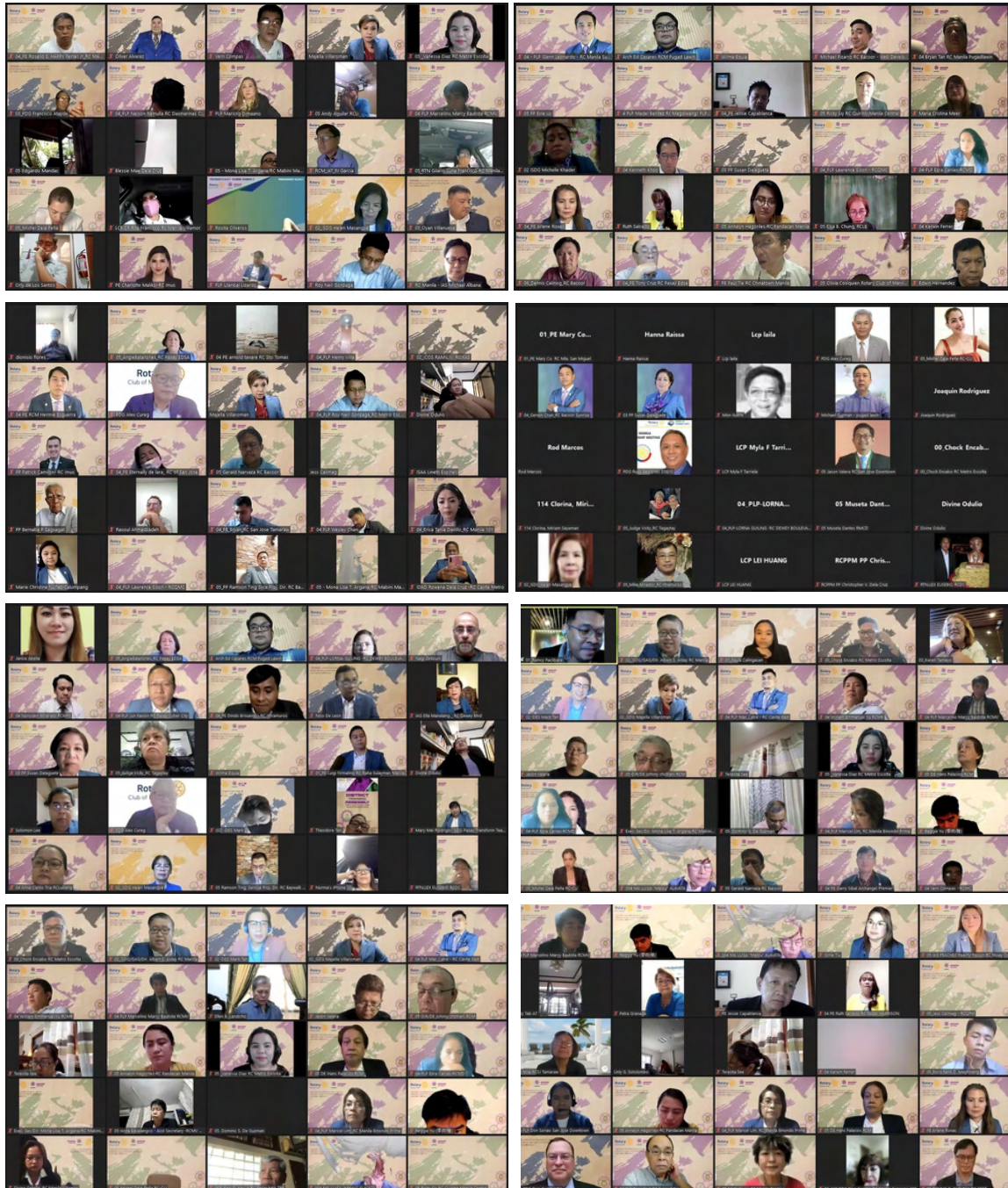

How to set your club on a good path for the new Rotary year

What makes one Rotary club vibrant and another one not? Sometimes, this is not always the easiest thing to understand. But I can vouch for the difference it makes during my own experience as a Rotary member for the past 12 years. And a lot of it stems from how effectively a club plans for and executes changeover in club leadership.

When I was president of my club in 2015-16, it was just my club's third year. The members had mixed levels of experience and enthusiasm. Some of them had been Rotary members for some time but a lot of them were brand new to Rotary. Everyone brought their own level of professionalism and expectations to the club.

I attended every training program my district governor had organized, and the instructions were meticulous. However, I found them much harder to implement.

Every Rotary year ushers in change, from the top down. It is part of what has helped Rotary thrive from year to year as new ideas and new perspectives are brought forward, and new leadership brings new energy.

But while we often think that every Rotary member understands and appreciates the changes that take place every 1 July, this is not always the case. In hindsight, I believe younger clubs need a different level of nurturing than more established ones.

I had a great board of directors, but we were not as effective as we could have been. The goals and objectives of the Rotary year and the requirements of each officer were not driven home as effectively as they could have been during our directors orientation program. As a result, members did their part, but a heavy burden fell on my shoulders to keep the club moving forward and in synch with the objectives of that Rotary year.

Was my experience unique? I do not believe so. I have since come to believe it is an experience faced by many younger clubs not prepared for the expectations of a new year and what is needed to drive the club forward and keep it on track.

I believe younger clubs need a different level of nurturing than more established ones.

Recently, I attended a directors orientation program by my president-elect Vidhya Subramanian, and I realized just how effective a club can be if members are more united toward common goals and there are innovative ways to drive the club's agenda.

The president-elect meticulously planned every detail and brought a variety of case studies to show common issues that can occur and ways to counter them. She had studies that addressed membership growth, engaging members especially dormant ones, getting past presidents to remain a part of club leadership, promoting giving to The Rotary Foundation, and getting everyone involved in service. She brought in some of the finest speakers including past district governors to share their inspiring stories. She enlisted the help of district and club trainers.

This level of commitment, and this passion, unites members and drives a club toward common goals. It leads to members who are fully engaged. It increases connections and friendships between members and leads to successful and lasting projects.

Rotary clubs, especially young clubs, will benefit if they can evolve from a "one size fits all" approach to leadership change. We need to give younger clubs more help and more support. And we need to embrace a custom mentality where club leadership teams find their own growth path and spend sufficient time explaining their goals and objectives to their members. If we can do that, great things will happen.

Straight from the Horse's Mouth

THE PASSING OF A PURPOSEFUL PILLAR.

“You have to have a grateful heart. Every day is a special day. You cannot be positive without being grateful,” he said. “You have to do with passion the things that you like to do.”

— Bobby Joseph

The life of ROBERT “Bobby” LIM JOSEPH was, in so many ways, exceptional. It vindicated his faith amid seemingly impossible odds; he redeemed that faith through a grateful heart; and overcame these odds to become, up until his passing, the longest living person with Stage 4 cancer.

But while being a cancer survivor — and the great epiphany of spiritual conviction that arose from his affliction — was perhaps the apogee of his personal triumph, he’d had many admirable feathers tucked in his colorful hat. Apart from being a staunch travel and tourism advocate, he was a passionate environmentalist, a champion of admirable causes, a wine connoisseur, and a businessman, a diplomat (honorary consul general of the Republic of Latvia to the Philippines since 1994), a book author, and a motivational speaker.

Bobby was best known as the pillar of the Philippine travel and tourism industry, whose career dated back to as far as the mid-sixties when he was named top salesman for Egypt Air from 1965 to 1979. As a trailblazer in aviation marketing, he was an unstoppable force of nature, accomplishing unprecedented milestones in the country’s travel sector. He promoted Korean culture as part of his work in Korean Air Lines, long before K-Pop became vogue. He once collaborated with Asia’s “Fashion Czar” Pitoy Moreno in mounting a fashion show in the sky — onboard a KAL 747 flying from Seoul to New York with the 747’s aisles as the catwalk. And amid the massive economic fallout from the political crises in the eighties,

he successfully spearheaded the Philippines' hosting of the 17th Annual World Airline Clubs Association (WACA) Convention in 1984. He founded the first travel cooperative in the Philippines for micro travel agencies, which quickly gained accreditation by the International Air Transport Association (IATA). He was president of the Network of Independent Travel Agencies (NITAS) as well as of the National Association of Independent Travel Agencies (NAITAS), with more than a hundred chapters all over the country.

Indeed, the capstone years of Philippine tourism was built by people like him. The industry was built by Bobby Josephs. He brought the tourism landscape a little bit closer to the pinnacle of the industry's highest goals. He, together with Gawad Kalinga founder Tony Meloto, endeavored to establish a sustainable farm tourism project in San Jose, Batangas called "Paraiso Village Social Tourism Farm." He also spearheaded the International School of Sustainable Tourism (ISST), as Vice-Chairman with former Tourism Secretary Mina Gabor as president.

But it was in his final years as President of the Rotary Club of Manila that I saw the man up-close-and-personal. As Club Secretary, I was at the front-and-center of his light which shone the brightest. Despite being aware of his ongoing medical condition, the members of Asia's oldest Rotary Club overwhelmingly elected him in absentia to lead them through the organization's most challenging moments. True to his mandate, he proved to all that there exists the capacity for great

courage, that in all of us there is a longing to do what's right, that in all of us there is a willingness to love all people, and to extend to them their God-given rights to dignity and respect. So many of us lose that sense. It's taught out of us. We start feeling as if, in fact, that we can't afford to extend kindness or decency to other people. But Bobby always saw the best in us. And when all seemed lost and the tide of public opinion seemed to be going against his way, he never gave up and never stopped speaking out because he saw the best in every single Rotarian. He believed in us even when we didn't believe in ourselves.

He didn't rest, even when his cancer was showing signs of recursion, along with its accompanying horrific side effects and pains. He would meet his Board almost on a daily basis — oftentimes, several times a day — to stave off a membership crisis. And, in the face of extended lockdowns during the worst of the pandemic, he even elevated what he started at the Manila Yacht Club in saving Manila Bay and by going nationwide in collaboration with the Department of the Interior and Local Government and other government agencies to support various projects for sustainability. When other Rotary Clubs were struggling to stay afloat, he continued getting bigger projects in collaboration with other Rotary clubs abroad to secure grants to help the Philippine General Hospital (PGH), the Tuloy Foundation of Father Rocky Evangelista, scholarships and student exchange programs, and outreach programs.

He astonished even the most dedicated workaholics during his punishing year as a dedicated Rotary leader with his cyclonic energy and confounded his skeptics with his steely resolve to accomplish the impossible, largely because of his “can-do” attitude to “optimism and positive thinking,” often masked in a disarmingly jovial demeanor.

His warm face and relaxed manner rarely revealed his inner feelings. Those who knew him well say Bobby Joseph was a fascinating paradox, an idealist who never abandoned the hard edge of reality, a man of high principle who, without ever compromising morality, could play a tough game to win his goals. Over the years, he had projected a commendable public modesty, but behind the humble exterior was a steely inner toughness.

Looking back at these past few years, I know that everything Bobby Joseph did had a purpose. He was a creative energizer of people, a man unafraid to make unpopular decisions, a natural mentor and leader.
